## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to public school students who have dyscalculia.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 4 SECTION 1. Section 7.102(c)(28), Education Code, is amended
- 5 to read as follows:
- 6 (28) The board shall approve a program for testing
- 7 students for dyslexia and related disorders <u>and for dyscalculia</u> as
- 8 provided by Section 38.003.
- 9 SECTION 2. Section 11.252(a), Education Code, is amended to
- 10 read as follows:
- 11 (a) Each school district shall have a district improvement
- 12 plan that is developed, evaluated, and revised annually, in
- 13 accordance with district policy, by the superintendent with the
- 14 assistance of the district-level committee established under
- 15 Section 11.251. The purpose of the district improvement plan is to
- 16 guide district and campus staff in the improvement of student
- 17 performance for all student groups in order to attain state
- 18 standards in respect to the student achievement indicators adopted
- 19 under Section 39.053. The district improvement plan must include
- 20 provisions for:
- 21 (1) a comprehensive needs assessment addressing
- 22 district student performance on the student achievement
- 23 indicators, and other appropriate measures of performance, that are
- 24 disaggregated by all student groups served by the district,

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- 1 including categories of ethnicity, socioeconomic status, sex, and
- 2 populations served by special programs, including students in
- 3 special education programs under Subchapter A, Chapter 29;
- 4 (2) measurable district performance objectives for
- 5 all appropriate student achievement indicators for all student
- 6 populations, including students in special education programs
- 7 under Subchapter A, Chapter 29, and other measures of student
- 8 performance that may be identified through the comprehensive needs
- 9 assessment;
- 10 (3) strategies for improvement of student performance
- 11 that include:
- 12 (A) instructional methods for addressing the
- 13 needs of student groups not achieving their full potential;
- 14 (B) methods for addressing the needs of students
- 15 for special programs, such as suicide prevention, conflict
- 16 resolution, violence prevention, or dyslexia or dyscalculia
- 17 treatment programs;
- 18 (C) dropout reduction;
- 19 (D) integration of technology in instructional
- 20 and administrative programs;
- 21 (E) discipline management;
- 22 (F) staff development for professional staff of
- 23 the district;
- 24 (G) career education to assist students in
- 25 developing the knowledge, skills, and competencies necessary for a
- 26 broad range of career opportunities; and
- 27 (H) accelerated education;

- 1 (4) strategies for providing to middle school, junior
- 2 high school, and high school students, those students' teachers and
- 3 counselors, and those students' parents information about:
- 4 (A) higher education admissions and financial
- 5 aid opportunities;
- 6 (B) the TEXAS grant program and the Teach for
- 7 Texas grant program established under Chapter 56;
- 8 (C) the need for students to make informed
- 9 curriculum choices to be prepared for success beyond high school;
- 10 and
- 11 (D) sources of information on higher education
- 12 admissions and financial aid;
- 13 (5) resources needed to implement identified
- 14 strategies;
- 15 (6) staff responsible for ensuring the accomplishment
- 16 of each strategy;
- 17 (7) timelines for ongoing monitoring of the
- 18 implementation of each improvement strategy; and
- 19 (8) formative evaluation criteria for determining
- 20 periodically whether strategies are resulting in intended
- 21 improvement of student performance.
- SECTION 3. Section 12.012(c), Education Code, is amended to
- 23 read as follows:
- (c) This section does not permit a home-rule school district
- 25 to discriminate against a student who has been diagnosed as having a
- 26 learning disability, including dyslexia, dyscalculia, or attention
- 27 deficit/hyperactivity disorder. Discrimination prohibited by this

- 1 subsection includes denial of placement in a gifted and talented
- 2 program if the student would otherwise be qualified for the program
- 3 but for the student's learning disability. This section does not
- 4 permit a home-rule school district to, on the basis of race,
- 5 socioeconomic status, learning disability, or family support
- 6 status, place a student in a program other than the highest-level
- 7 program necessary to ensure the student's success.
- 8 SECTION 4. Section 21.0482(c), Education Code, is amended
- 9 to read as follows:
- 10 (c) To be eligible for a master mathematics teacher
- 11 certificate, a person must:
- 12 (1) hold a teaching certificate issued under this
- 13 subchapter;
- 14 (2) have at least three years of teaching experience;
- 15 (3) satisfactorily complete a knowledge-based course
- 16 of instruction on the science of teaching children mathematics that
- 17 includes training in:
- 18 (A) mathematics instruction;
- 19 <u>(B) identification of dyscalculia and effective</u>
- 20 mathematics instruction techniques for students with dyscalculia;
- 21 and
- 22 <u>(C)</u> professional peer mentoring techniques that,
- 23 through scientific testing, have been proven effective;
- 24 (4) perform satisfactorily on the appropriate master
- 25 mathematics teacher certification examination prescribed by the
- 26 board; and
- 27 (5) satisfy any other requirements prescribed by the

- 1 board.
- 2 SECTION 5. The heading to Section 38.003, Education Code,
- 3 is amended to read as follows:
- 4 Sec. 38.003. SCREENING AND TREATMENT FOR DYSLEXIA AND
- 5 RELATED DISORDERS AND FOR DYSCALCULIA.
- 6 SECTION 6. Sections 38.003(a), (b), and (d), Education
- 7 Code, are amended to read as follows:
- 8 (a) Students enrolling in public schools in this state shall
- 9 be tested for dyslexia and related disorders and for dyscalculia at
- 10 appropriate times in accordance with a program approved by the
- 11 State Board of Education.
- 12 (b) In accordance with the program approved by the State
- 13 Board of Education, the board of trustees of each school district
- 14 shall provide for the treatment of any student determined to have
- 15 dyslexia or a related disorder or dyscalculia.
- 16 (d) In this section:
- 17 (1) "Dyscalculia" means a specific learning
- 18 disability or difficulty involving innate difficulty in learning or
- 19 comprehending mathematics.
- 20 (2) "Dyslexia" means a disorder of constitutional
- 21 origin manifested by a difficulty in learning to read, write, or
- 22 spell, despite conventional instruction, adequate intelligence,
- 23 and sociocultural opportunity.
- 24 (3) [<del>(2)</del>] "Related disorders" includes disorders
- 25 similar to or related to dyslexia, such as developmental auditory
- 26 imperception, dysphasia, specific developmental dyslexia,
- 27 developmental dysgraphia, and developmental spelling disability.

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- 1 SECTION 7. Section 42.152(c-1), Education Code, is amended
- 2 to read as follows:
- 3 (c-1) Notwithstanding Subsection (c), funds allocated under
- 4 this section may be used to fund in proportion to the percentage of
- 5 students served by the program that meet the criteria in Section
- 6 29.081(d) or (g):
- 7 (1) an accelerated reading instruction program under
- 8 Section 28.006(g); or
- 9 (2) a program for treatment of students who have
- 10 dyslexia or a related disorder or dyscalculia, as required by
- 11 Section 38.003.
- 12 SECTION 8. Section 21.0482(c), Education Code, as amended
- 13 by this Act, applies only to eligibility for a master mathematics
- 14 teacher certificate issued on or after January 1, 2013.
- 15 SECTION 9. This Act applies beginning with the 2011-2012
- 16 school year.
- 17 SECTION 10. This Act takes effect immediately if it
- 18 receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each
- 19 house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution.
- 20 If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate
- 21 effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
