(g) Not later than December 1 of each even-numbered year, the department shall submit a report to the legislature regarding the department's <u>operation of</u> [<del>progress in establishing and</del> <del>operating</del>] the demonstration project.

1 SECTION 2. The change in law made by this Act applies only 2 to a person who receives medical assistance under Chapter 32, Human 3 Resources Code, on or after the effective date of this Act, 4 regardless of the date on which eligibility for the medical 5 assistance was determined.

6 SECTION 3. If before implementing Section 32.0248, Human 7 Resources Code, as amended by this Act, a state agency determines 8 that an amendment to the existing waiver or other authorization is 9 necessary to extend the operation of the demonstration project for women's health care services under that section as amended, the 10 agency affected by the provision shall request the amendment to the 11 waiver or other authorization and may delay implementing that 12 section until the amendment or other authorization is granted. 13

SECTION 4. This Act takes effect August 31, 2011.
