- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. This Act shall be known as Paisley's Law.
- 6 SECTION 2. Section 42.042(e), Human Resources Code, is
- 7 amended to read as follows:
- 8 (e) The department shall promulgate minimum standards that
- 9 apply to licensed child-care facilities and to registered family
- 10 homes covered by this chapter and that will:
- 11 (1) promote the health, safety, and welfare of
- 12 children attending a facility or registered family home;
- 13 (2) promote safe, comfortable, and healthy physical
- 14 facilities and registered family homes for children;
- 15 (3) ensure adequate supervision of children by
- 16 capable, qualified, and healthy personnel;
- 17 (4) ensure adequate and healthy food service where
- 18 food service is offered;
- 19 (5) prohibit racial discrimination by child-care
- 20 facilities and registered family homes;
- 21 (6) require procedures for parental and guardian
- 22 consultation in the formulation of children's educational and
- 23 therapeutic programs; [and]
- 24 (7) prevent the breakdown of foster care and adoptive

- 1 placement; and
- 2 (8) ensure that a child-care facility or registered
- 3 <u>family home follows the directions of a child's physician or other</u>
- 4 health care provider in providing specialized medical assistance
- 5 required by the child.
- 6 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 7 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 8 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 9 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 10 Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
