- 5 SECTION 1. Subchapter A, Chapter 11, Education Code, is 6 amended by adding Section 11.004 to read as follows:
- Sec. 11.004. EXEMPTION FROM CERTAIN STATE EDUCATIONAL

 MANDATES. (a) In this section, "state educational mandate" means a

 statutory provision the implementation of which requires an

 expenditure by a school district that would not have been required

 in the absence of the statutory provision or a rule adopted under

 that provision.
- 13 (b) A school district is exempt from a state educational
 14 mandate for which the legislature has not appropriated money
 15 estimated to be sufficient to meet the expenditure required by the
 16 mandate at the time the mandate is effective unless the legislature
 17 has determined that the mandate fulfills an important state
 18 interest and:
- (1) the expenditure is required to comply with a law
 that applies to all persons similarly situated, including entities
 other than a school district; or
- 22 (2) the mandate is necessary either to comply with 23 federal law or to meet eligibility standards for a federal 24 entitlement, and the federal law specifically contemplates action

- 1 by a district for compliance or eligibility.
- 2 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 3 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 4 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 5 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 6 Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
