2	relating to authorizing the adjutant general to operate post
3	exchanges on state military property.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subchapter B, Chapter 431, Government Code, is
6	amended by adding Section 431.040 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 431.040. POST EXCHANGES ON STATE MILITARY PROPERTY.
8	(a) The adjutant general may establish and operate military-type
9	post exchanges similar to those operated by the armed forces of the
10	United States on any real property under the management and control
11	of the department. A post exchange may sell, lease, or rent goods
12	and services, including alcohol, tobacco products, and prepared
13	foods. The adjutant general may designate facilities located on
14	department property to use for purposes of this section.
15	(b) The adjutant general shall adopt rules to govern post
16	exchanges established under this section that are similar to the
17	procedures, policies, and restrictions governing exchanges of the
18	Army and Air Force Exchange Service, including rules that require
19	an individual to show identification that indicates that the
20	individual is qualified to buy, lease, or rent goods at the post

exchange.

(c) The adjutant general may:

- 1 (2) contract with a person to operate a post exchange
- 2 created under this section.
- 3 (d) A post exchange may sell, lease, or rent goods and
- 4 services only to:
- 5 (1) active, retired, and reserve members of the United
- 6 States armed services;
- 7 (2) active and retired members of the state military
- 8 forces;
- 9 (3) full-time employees of the adjutant general's
- 10 department; and
- 11 (4) dependents of an individual described by
- 12 Subdivisions (1)-(3).
- 13 (e) The post exchange services account is an account in the
- 14 general revenue fund. Money in the account may be appropriated only
- 15 to the department for the purposes of this section. The post
- 16 exchange services account is exempt from the application of Section
- 17 403.095. The account consists of:
- 18 (1) money received from sales at post exchanges
- 19 created under this section; and
- 20 (2) notwithstanding Section 404.071, all interest
- 21 attributable to money held in the account.
- 22 <u>(f) A post exchange created under this section may sell</u>
- 23 goods and services including alcoholic beverages for off-premises
- 24 consumption, without holding a license or permit issued by the
- 25 <u>comptroller</u> or the Texas Alcoholic Beverage Commission.
- 26 Notwithstanding any other law, the department may use appropriated
- 27 money to purchase alcoholic beverages for sale at a post exchange.

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- 1 SECTION 2. Subchapter H, Chapter 151, Tax Code, is amended
- 2 by adding Section 151.344 to read as follows:
- 3 Sec. 151.344. POST EXCHANGES ON STATE MILITARY PROPERTY. A
- 4 taxable item sold, leased, or rented to, or stored, used, or
- 5 consumed by, a post exchange under Section 431.040, Government
- 6 Code, is exempt from the taxes imposed by this chapter.
- 7 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 8 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 9 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 10 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 11 Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
