1 (b) Section 51.949, Education Code, as added by this Act, 2 does not affect the terms of a contract entered into before the 3 effective date of this Act, except that if the contract is renewed, 4 modified, or extended on or after the effective date of this Act, 5 Section 51.949 applies to the contract beginning on the date of 6 renewal, modification, or extension.

7 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 8 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 9 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 10 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 11 Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
