A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

- 2 relating to the allocation of the value of certain federal
- 3 allowances for carbon dioxide emissions granted to certain electric
- 4 or gas utilities.

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- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Subchapter B, Chapter 36, Utilities Code, is
- 7 amended by adding Section 36.066 to read as follows:
- 8 Sec. 36.066. TREATMENT OF VALUE OF CERTAIN FEDERAL
- 9 ALLOWANCES FOR CARBON DIOXIDE EMISSIONS. To the extent federal law
- 10 provides an electric utility with free or subsidized-cost carbon
- 11 dioxide emissions allowances, the regulatory authority by rule or
- 12 by ordinance shall ensure that the economic value of the allowances
- 13 <u>is passed on to the end user of the utility's electric service and</u>
- 14 is reflected on that user's bill.
- 15 SECTION 2. Subchapter E, Chapter 39, Utilities Code, is
- 16 amended by adding Section 39.207 to read as follows:
- 17 Sec. 39.207. TREATMENT OF VALUE OF CERTAIN FEDERAL
- 18 ALLOWANCES FOR CARBON DIOXIDE EMISSIONS. To the extent federal law
- 19 provides an electric utility with free or subsidized-cost carbon
- 20 dioxide emissions allowances, the commission by rule shall ensure
- 21 that the economic value of the allowances is passed on to and is
- 22 <u>reflected on the bill of the end user of the utility's electric</u>
- 23 service through the transmission and distribution utility's
- 24 charges appearing on that user's bill from the retail electric

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- 1 provider.
- 2 SECTION 3. Subchapter B, Chapter 104, Utilities Code, is
- 3 amended by adding Section 104.059 to read as follows:
- 4 Sec. 104.059. TREATMENT OF VALUE OF CERTAIN FEDERAL
- 5 ALLOWANCES FOR CARBON DIOXIDE EMISSIONS. To the extent federal law
- 6 provides a gas utility with free or subsidized-cost carbon dioxide
- 7 emissions allowances, the regulatory authority by rule or by
- 8 ordinance shall ensure that the economic value of the allowances is
- 9 passed on to the end user of the gas utility's gas service and is
- 10 reflected on that user's bill.
- 11 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
