## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

2 relating to the consequences of successfully completing a period of

- 3 deferred adjudication community supervision.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 5(c), Article 42.12, Code of Criminal
- 6 Procedure, is amended to read as follows:
- 7 (c) On expiration of a community supervision period imposed
- 8 under Subsection (a), if the judge has not proceeded to
- 9 adjudication of guilt, the judge shall dismiss the proceedings
- 10 against the defendant and discharge him. The judge may dismiss the
- 11 proceedings and discharge a defendant, other than a defendant
- 12 charged with an offense requiring the defendant to register as a sex
- 13 offender under Chapter 62, prior to the expiration of the term of
- 14 community supervision if in the judge's opinion the best interest
- 15 of society and the defendant will be served. The judge may not
- 16 dismiss the proceedings and discharge a defendant charged with an
- 17 offense requiring the defendant to register under Chapter 62.
- 18 Except as provided by Section 12.42(g), Penal Code, a dismissal and
- 19 discharge under this section may not be deemed a conviction for the
- 20 purposes of disqualifications or disabilities imposed by law for
- 21 conviction of an offense. Notwithstanding any other law, a
- 22 <u>dismissal</u> and <u>discharge</u> under this section may be used only as
- 23 <u>described</u> by Section 12.42(g)(1), Penal Code, or as otherwise
- 24 described by this subsection. A dismissal and discharge under this

- 1 section may not be used as grounds for denying housing, employment,
- 2 or a professional license to an individual who is otherwise
- 3 entitled to or qualified for the housing, employment, or license.
- 4 For any defendant who receives a dismissal and discharge under this
- 5 section, [÷
- 6  $\left[\frac{(1)}{(1)}\right]$  upon conviction of a subsequent offense, the
- 7 fact that the defendant had previously received community
- 8 supervision with a deferred adjudication of guilt shall be
- 9 admissible before the court or jury to be considered on the issue of
- 10 penalty[+
- 11 [(2) if the defendant is an applicant for a license or
- 12 is a licensee under Chapter 42, Human Resources Code, the
- 13 Department of Family and Protective Services may consider the fact
- 14 that the defendant previously has received community supervision
- 15 with a deferred adjudication of guilt under this section in
- 16 issuing, renewing, denying, or revoking a license under that
- 17 chapter; and
- 18 [(3) if the defendant is a person who has applied for
- 19 registration to provide mental health or medical services for the
- 20 rehabilitation of sex offenders, the Council on Sex Offender
- 21 Treatment may consider the fact that the defendant has received
- 22 community supervision under this section in issuing, renewing,
- 23 denying, or revoking a license or registration issued by that
- 24 council].
- 25 SECTION 2. The change in law made by this Act applies only
- 26 to a defendant placed on deferred adjudication community
- 27 supervision for an offense committed on or after the effective date

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- 1 of this Act. A defendant placed on deferred adjudication community
- 2 supervision for an offense committed before the effective date of
- 3 this Act is covered by the law in effect when the offense was
- 4 committed, and the former law is continued in effect for that
- 5 purpose. For purposes of this section, an offense was committed
- 6 before the effective date of this Act if any element of the offense
- 7 was committed before that date.
- 8 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
