4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

5 SECTION 1. Section 166.102(b), Health and Safety Code, is 6 amended to read as follows:

7 (b) When responding to a call for assistance, emergency 8 medical services personnel:

9 <u>(1)</u> shall honor only a properly executed or issued 10 out-of-hospital DNR order or prescribed DNR identification device 11 in accordance with this subchapter; and

12 (2) have no duty to review, examine, interpret, or 13 honor a person's other written directive, including a written 14 directive in the form prescribed by Section 166.033.

SECTION 2. Subchapter A, Chapter 773, Health and Safety Code, is amended by adding Section 773.016 to read as follows:

17 <u>Sec. 773.016. DUTIES OF EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES</u> 18 <u>PERSONNEL; CERTAIN EMERGENCY PREHOSPITAL CARE SITUATIONS. (a) In</u> 19 <u>this section, "cardiopulmonary resuscitation" has the meaning</u> 20 <u>assigned by Section 166.002.</u>

21 (b) Emergency medical services personnel who are providing 22 emergency prehospital care to a person are subject to Chapter 166, 23 including Section 166.102.

24 (c) If a person's personal physician is present and assumes

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responsibility for the care of the person under the applicable 1 requirements of Chapter 197, Title 22, Texas Administrative Code, 2 while the person is receiving emergency prehospital care, the 3 physician may order the termination of cardiopulmonary 4 5 resuscitation only if, based on the physician's professional medical judgment, the physician determines that resuscitation 6 7 should be discontinued. 8 (d) If a person's personal physician is not present or does not assume responsibility for the care of the person while the 9 person is receiving emergency prehospital care, the emergency 10 medical services system's medical director or online physician: 11 12 (1) shall be responsible for directing the emergency medical services personnel who are providing emergency prehospital 13 14 care to the person; and 15 (2) may order the termination of cardiopulmonary resuscitation only if, based on the medical director's or online 16 17 physician's professional medical judgment, the medical director or online physician determines that resuscitation should be 18 19 discontinued. SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 20 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 21 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 22

23 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
24 Act takes effect September 1, 2011.

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
