- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Subchapter B, Chapter 166, Health and Safety
- 6 Code, is amended by adding Section 166.054 to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 166.054. COMPLIANCE WITH WRITTEN DIRECTIVE; CERTAIN
- 8 EMERGENCY PREHOSPITAL CARE SITUATIONS. (a) In this section:
- 9 <u>(1) "Emergency medical services personnel" has the</u>
- 10 meaning assigned by Section 773.003.
- 11 (2) "Emergency prehospital care" has the meaning
- 12 assigned by Section 773.003.
- (b) Notwithstanding any other provision of this chapter,
- 14 emergency medical services personnel who are providing emergency
- 15 prehospital care to a person are not required to review, examine,
- 16 interpret, or honor a person's written directive, including a
- 17 written directive in the form prescribed by Section 166.033.
- SECTION 2. Subchapter A, Chapter 773, Health and Safety
- 19 Code, is amended by adding Section 773.016 to read as follows:
- 20 <u>Sec. 773.016. DUTIES OF EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES</u>
- 21 PERSONNEL; CERTAIN EMERGENCY PREHOSPITAL CARE SITUATIONS. (a) In
- 22 this section, "cardiopulmonary resuscitation" has the meaning
- 23 assigned by Section 166.002.
- 24 (b) Emergency medical services personnel who are providing

- 1 emergency prehospital care to a person are subject to Chapter 166,
- 2 <u>including Section 166.054.</u>
- 3 (c) A physician who is present while a person is receiving
- 4 emergency prehospital care may order the termination of
- 5 cardiopulmonary resuscitation if, based on the physician's
- 6 professional medical judgment, the physician determines that
- 7 resuscitation should be discontinued.
- 8 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 9 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 10 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 11 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 12 Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
