Section 91.042, Labor Code, is amended by adding 10 Subsections (g), (h), and (i) to read as follows: 11 12 (g) On the written request of a client company, a license holder that elects to provide workers' compensation insurance for 13 14 assigned employees shall provide to the client company a list of: (1) claims associated with that client company made 15 16 against the license holder's workers' compensation policy; and (2) payments made and reserves established on each 17 claim. 18 (h) The license holder shall provide the information 19 described by Subsection (g) in writing not later than the 60th day 20 21 after the date the license holder receives the client company's written request. For purposes of this subsection, information is 22 23 considered to be provided to the client company on the date the information is: 24

6	SECTION 3. Subchapter A, Chapter 415, Labor Code, is
7	amended by adding Section 415.011 to read as follows:
8	Sec. 415.011. NOTICE OF STAFF LEASING SERVICES COMPANY
9	WORKERS' COMPENSATION CLAIM AND PAYMENT INFORMATION;
10	ADMINISTRATIVE VIOLATION. (a) A staff leasing services company
11	license holder commits a violation if the license holder fails to
12	provide the information required by Sections 91.042(g) and (h).
13	(b) A violation under Subsection (a) is a Class D
14	administrative violation.
15	SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
