REGULATION OF LAND DEVELOPMENT IN CERTAIN COUNTIES 8 9 Sec. 231A.001. PURPOSE. The powers granted under this chapter are for the purpose of promoting the public health, safety, 10 or general welfare. 11 12 Sec. 231A.002. APPLICABILITY. This chapter applies only to a county with a population of more than one million in which a 13 14 national wildlife refuge is wholly or partly located. Sec. 231A.003. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter: 15 16 (1) "Agricultural use" means use or activity involving 17 agriculture. 18 (2) "Agriculture" means: 19 (A) cultivating the soil to produce crops for human food, animal feed, seed for planting, or the production of 20 fibers; 21 22 (B) practicing floriculture, viticulture, 23 silviculture, or horticulture; 24 (C) raising, feeding, or keeping animals for

1 breeding purposes or for the production of food, fiber, leather, pelts, or other tangible products having commercial value, with the 2 3 exception of feedlots; 4 (D) planting cover crops, including cover crops cultivated for transplantation, or leaving land idle for the 5 purpose of participating in a government program or normal crop or 6 7 livestock rotation procedure; or 8 (E) engaging in wildlife management. 9 (3) "Buffer zone" means the distance between a structure, device, item, equipment, or enclosure used for an 10 activity at the site of an industry and the nearest property 11 12 boundary of a land use described by Section 231A.004(a). (4) "Industry" means use or activity involving: 13 14 (A) manufacturing; 15 (B) light or heavy industry; 16 (C) transportation facilities, including 17 trucking depots, marinas, or airports; 18 (D) resource extraction, including mining or 19 construction materials processing; or 20 (E) warehousing. 21 Sec. 231A.004. BUFFER ZONE REGULATION. (a) Except as provided by Subsection (c), the commissioners court of a county may 22 adopt a regulation under this chapter to require a buffer zone 23 24 between an industry and a residential area, hospital, elder-care facility, school, day-care facility, church, or similar land use 25 26 that the commissioners court finds to be incompatible with the 27 industry.

23	(2) coordinated with the comprehensive plans of
24	municipalities located in the county.
25	Sec. 231A.006. PROCEDURE GOVERNING ADOPTION OF
26	REGULATIONS. (a) The commissioners court shall establish a
27	technical advisory committee to develop and recommend buffer zone

1	regulations to the court. The commissioners court shall appoint
2	the members of the committee. The committee must include industry
3	representatives.
4	(b) A buffer zone regulation under this chapter is not
5	effective until the regulation is adopted by the commissioners
6	court after a public hearing. Before the 15th day before the date
7	of the hearing, the commissioners court must publish notice of the
8	hearing in a newspaper of general circulation in the county.
9	(c) The commissioners court may establish or amend a buffer
10	zone regulation only by an order passed by a majority vote of the
11	full membership of the court.
12	Sec. 231A.007. COMPREHENSIVE PLAN. (a) The commissioners
13	court may adopt a comprehensive plan for land development in the
14	unincorporated area of the county.
15	(b) The comprehensive plan must be designed to:
16	(1) lessen congestion in the streets;
17	(2) secure safety from fire, panic, and other dangers;
18	(3) promote health and the general welfare;
19	(4) provide adequate light and air; or
20	(5) facilitate the adequate provision of
21	transportation, water, sewers, schools, parks, and other public
22	requirements.
23	(c) A comprehensive plan must be consistent with the
24	comprehensive plans of municipalities located in the county.
25	Sec. 231A.008. INCENTIVES. The commissioners court may
26	provide incentives to a person who develops land in the
27	unincorporated area of the county in compliance with the county

1 comprehensive plan adopted under Section 231A.007. 2 Sec. 231A.009. SPECIAL EXCEPTION. (a) A person aggrieved 3 by a buffer zone regulation adopted under this chapter may petition the commissioners court for a special exception to the regulation 4 5 adopted by the commissioners court. 6 (b) The commissioners court may grant a special exception 7 that allows for the reduction or elimination of a buffer zone if the 8 person subject to the buffer zone requirement can demonstrate that the reduction or elimination of the buffer zone adequately protects 9 10 the public health, safety, or general welfare. (c) The commissioners court shall adopt procedures 11 12 governing applications, notice, hearings, and other matters relating to the grant of a special exception. 13 14 Sec. 231A.010. ENFORCEMENT; PENALTY. (a) The 15 commissioners court may adopt orders to enforce this chapter or an order or buffer zone regulation adopted under this chapter. 16 17 (b) A person commits an offense if the person violates an order or regulation adopted under this chapter. An offense under 18 19 this subsection is a misdemeanor punishable by a fine of not less than \$500 or more than \$1,000. Each day that a violation occurs 20 constitutes a separate offense. Trial shall be in the district 21 22 court. Sec. 231A.011. COOPERATION WITH MUNICIPALITIES. The 23 24 commissioners court by order may enter into agreements with any municipality located in the county to assist in the implementation 25 26 and enforcement of buffer zone regulations adopted under this 27 chapter.

Sec. 231A.012. EXISTING AUTHORITY UNAFFECTED. 1 The 2 authority granted by this chapter does not affect the authority of the commissioners court to adopt an order to regulate land 3 4 development under other law. Sec. 231A.013. CONFLICT WITH OTHER LAWS. If a buffer zone 5 6 regulation adopted under this chapter imposes higher standards than those required under another statute or local order or regulation, 7 8 the regulation adopted under this chapter controls. If the other 9 statute or local order or regulation imposes higher standards, that

10 statute, order, or regulation controls.

11 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 12 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 13 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 14 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 15 Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
