A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
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- 2 relating to the regulation of massage therapists, massage
- 3 establishments, massage schools, and sexually oriented businesses;
- 4 providing penalties.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Section 455.001, Occupations Code, is amended by
- 7 amending Subdivisions (7) and (8) and adding Subdivisions (9-a)
- 8 through (9-e) to read as follows:
- 9 (7) "Massage therapist" means a person who practices,
- 10 [er] administers, or offers to practice or administer massage
- 11 therapy or other massage services to a client for
- 12 compensation. The term includes a licensed massage therapist,
- 13 therapeutic massage practitioner, massage technician, masseur,
- 14 masseuse, myotherapist, body massager, body rubber, or any
- 15 derivation of those titles.
- 16 (8) "Massage therapy" means the manipulation of soft
- 17 tissue by hand or through a mechanical or electrical apparatus for
- 18 the purpose of body massage and includes effleurage (stroking),
- 19 petrissage (kneading), tapotement (percussion), compression,
- 20 vibration, friction, nerve strokes, reflexology, and Swedish
- 21 gymnastics. The terms "massage," "therapeutic massage," "massage
- 22 technology," "myotherapy," "body massage," "body rub," or any
- 23 derivation of those terms are synonyms for "massage therapy."
- 24 (9-a) "Nude" means a person who is:

1	(A) entirely unclothed; or
2	(B) clothed in a manner that leaves uncovered or
3	visible through less than fully opaque clothing any portion of the
4	breasts below the top of the areola of the breasts or any portion of
5	the genitals or buttocks.
6	(9-b) "Operator" means a person who is supervising a
7	massage establishment or massage school at the time a violation
8	occurs or the establishment or school is inspected. If no person
9	is supervising, any employee, contractor, or agent of the owner who
10	is present at the establishment or school at the time of the
11	violation or inspection is the operator.
12	(9-c) "Owner" includes a person:
13	(A) in whose name a certificate of occupancy or
14	other certificate reflecting compliance with a regulation of a
15	political subdivision has been issued for a massage establishment
16	or massage school and any person having control over that person; or
17	(B) who operates a massage establishment or
18	massage school under a lease, operating agreement, or other
19	arrangement.
20	(9-d) "Reflexology" means a treatment method involving
21	the manipulation of reflex areas in the hands and feet with the
22	practitioner's hand, fingers, and thumb.
23	(9-e) "Sexual contact" includes:
24	(A) any touching of any part of the genitalia or
25	anus;
26	(B) any touching of the breasts of a female
27	without the written consent of the female;

- (C) any offer or agreement to engage in any activity described in Paragraph (A) or (B);

 (D) kissing without the consent of both persons;

 (E) deviate sexual intercourse, sexual contact, sexual intercourse, indecent exposure, sexual assault, prostitution, and promotion of prostitution as described in
- 7 Chapters 21 22 and 43 Donal Code or any offer or agreement to
- 7 Chapters 21, 22, and 43, Penal Code, or any offer or agreement to
- 8 engage in such activities;
- 9 (F) any behavior, gesture, or expression that may
- 10 reasonably be interpreted as inappropriately seductive or sexual;
- 11 or
- (G) inappropriate sexual comments about or to a
- 13 client, including sexual comments about a person's body.
- SECTION 2. Section 455.104, Occupations Code, is amended by
- 15 adding Subsection (a-1) to read as follows:
- 16 <u>(a-1)</u> The department, its authorized representative, or a
- 17 peace officer may enter the premises of a place of business that
- 18 represents itself as a massage establishment, regardless of whether
- 19 the business holds an appropriate license issued under this chapter
- 20 at any time that the department or peace officer considers
- 21 necessary to ensure compliance with this chapter and the rules
- 22 adopted under this chapter.
- 23 SECTION 3. Section 455.202(a), Occupations Code, is amended
- 24 to read as follows:
- 25 (a) A massage establishment may employ only licensed
- 26 massage therapists to perform or offer to perform massage therapy
- 27 or other massage services.

- 1 SECTION 4. Section 455.204, Occupations Code, is amended to
- 2 read as follows:
- 3 Sec. 455.204. DISPLAY OF LICENSE. (a) A person who holds a
- 4 license shall publicly display the <u>original</u> license as specified by
- 5 the department.
- 6 (b) Each massage establishment must post in plain sight the
- 7 original license for each massage therapist who practices in the
- 8 massage establishment.
- 9 (c) Each massage school, massage establishment, massage
- 10 therapy instructor, or massage therapist shall present the person's
- 11 original license on the request of the department, an authorized
- 12 representative of the department, or a peace officer.
- 13 (d) On the request of a peace officer, a massage therapist
- 14 shall present:
- 15 (1) if the person is a United States citizen, the
- 16 person's valid driver's license or identification card issued by a
- 17 state in the United States; or
- 18 (2) if the person is not a United States citizen, the
- 19 person's:
- 20 (A) passport or other identification card issued
- 21 by a governmental agency; and
- (B) valid work permit.
- (e) In this section, a person is considered to publicly
- 24 display a license or to post the license in plain sight if the
- 25 license is visible from an area readily accessible by the public.
- SECTION 5. Section 455.205, Occupations Code, is amended by
- 27 amending Subsections (a) and (d) and adding Subsection (f) to read

- 1 as follows:
- 2 (a) A massage therapist may not:
- 3 <u>(1)</u> perform <u>or offer to perform</u> massage therapy <u>or</u>
- 4 other massage services for compensation or without compensation at
- 5 or for:
- 6 (A) a sexually oriented business; or
- 7 (B) a place of business that represents itself as
- 8 a massage establishment, unless the establishment holds an
- 9 appropriate license issued under this chapter;
- 10 (2) perform or offer to perform massage therapy or
- 11 other massage services for compensation or without compensation
- 12 unless the massage therapist is a United States citizen or a legal
- 13 permanent resident with a valid work permit; or
- 14 (3) while nude or in clothing designed to arouse or
- 15 gratify the sexual desire of an individual, provide massage therapy
- 16 or other massage services to a customer.
- 17 (d) A sexually oriented business may not use the word
- 18 "massage," [or] "bath," or "spa" on a sign or any form of
- 19 advertising.
- 20 <u>(f) While in a massage establishment, a person may not:</u>
- 21 (1) engage in sexual conduct;
- 22 (2) possess a device or item intended to provide
- 23 sexual stimulation or sexual gratification to any person; or
- 24 (3) possess clothing designed to arouse or gratify the
- 25 sexual desire of any person.
- SECTION 6. Section 455.352, Occupations Code, is amended by
- 27 amending Subsections (a) and (e) and adding Subsection (c-1) to

- 1 read as follows:
- 2 (a) A person commits an offense if the person is required to
- 3 be licensed under this chapter and the person:
- 4 (1) knowingly violates Section 455.151, 455.159,
- 5 455.202(b), 455.203(a) or (c), 455.204(b) or (c), or 455.205(b),
- 6 (c), [or] (d), or (f); or
- 7 (2) collects or agrees to a fee or any other form of
- 8 compensation for massage therapy without being licensed under this
- 9 chapter.
- 10 <u>(c-1)</u> A person commits an offense if the person violates a
- 11 <u>rule adopted under this chap</u>ter.
- 12 (e) If it is shown at the trial of an offense under this
- 13 section that the defendant has been previously convicted:
- 14 (1) of an offense under this section, the offense is a
- 15 Class A misdemeanor; or
- 16 (2) two or more times of an offense under this section,
- 17 the offense is a state jail felony.
- 18 SECTION 7. Sections 451.202(d) and 451.351(i), Occupations
- 19 Code, are repealed.
- 20 SECTION 8. The change in law made by this Act applies only
- 21 to an offense committed on or after the effective date of this Act.
- 22 An offense committed before the effective date of this Act is
- 23 governed by the law in effect on the date the offense was committed,
- 24 and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose. For
- 25 purposes of this section, an offense was committed before the
- 26 effective date of this Act if any element of the offense occurred
- 27 before that date.

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1 SECTION 9. This Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
