## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to the assessment of damages to a property owner from
3	condemnation.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Section 21.041, Property Code, is amended to
6	read as follows:
7	Sec. 21.041. EVIDENCE. As the basis for assessing actual
8	damages to a property owner from a condemnation, the special
9	commissioners shall admit evidence on:

- 10 (1) the value of the property being condemned;
- 11 (2) the injury to the property owner, including, if
- 12 the condemnation makes relocation of a homestead, farm, or business
- 13 necessary, the financial damages associated with the cost of
- 14 relocating from the condemned property to another property:
- 15 (A) in the same municipality or, if the property
- 16 is not in an incorporated area, the same county; and
- 17 (B) that allows the property owner, without the
- 18 necessity of incurring an amount of debt, debt service, or total
- 19 projected interest obligation that is higher than the property
- 20 owner was subject to immediately before the condemnation, to:
- (i) have a standard of living comparable to
- 22 the property owner's standard of living immediately before the
- 23 condemnation, if the condemned property is a homestead that is
- 24 habitable; or

1 (ii) operate a comparable farm or business,

## 2 if the condemned property is a farm or business;

- 3 (3) the benefit to the property owner's remaining
- 4 property; and
- 5 (4) the use of the property for the purpose of the
- 6 condemnation.
- 7 SECTION 2. Section 21.042(d), Property Code, is amended to
- 8 read as follows:
- 9 (d) In estimating injury or benefit under Subsection (c),
- 10 the special commissioners shall consider an injury or benefit that
- 11 is peculiar to the property owner, including the property owner's
- 12 <u>financial damages described by Section 21.041(2)</u>, and that relates
- 13 to the property owner's ownership, use, or enjoyment of the
- 14 particular parcel of real property, but they may not consider an
- 15 injury or benefit that the property owner experiences in common
- 16 with the general community.
- 17 SECTION 3. The change in law made by this Act applies only
- 18 to a condemnation proceeding in which the petition is filed on or
- 19 after the effective date of this Act. A condemnation proceeding in
- 20 which the petition is filed before the effective date of this Act is
- 21 governed by the law in effect immediately before the effective date
- 22 of this Act, and that law is continued in effect for that purpose.
- 23 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 24 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 25 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 26 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 27 Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
