- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 29.006, Education Code, is amended to
- 6 read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 29.006. CONTINUING ADVISORY COMMITTEE. (a) The
- 8 governor shall appoint a continuing advisory committee, composed of
- 9 17 members, under 20 U.S.C. Section 1412(a)(21). At least one
- 10 member appointed under this subsection must be a director of
- 11 special education programs for a school district or for a shared
- 12 services arrangement of multiple school districts as provided by
- 13 Section 29.007.
- 14 (b) The appointments are not subject to confirmation by the
- 15 senate.
- 16 (c) Members of the committee are appointed for staggered
- 17 terms of four years with the terms of eight or nine members expiring
- 18 on February 1 of each odd-numbered year.
- 19 SECTION 2. Not later than February 1, 2013, the governor
- 20 shall appoint a member to the continuing advisory committee as
- 21 necessary to ensure that the composition of the committee complies
- 22 with Section 29.006, Education Code, as amended by this Act.
- 23 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 24 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as

- 1 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 2 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 3 Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
