- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 12.1056, Education Code, is amended to
- 6 read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 12.1056. IMMUNITY [FROM LIABILITY]. (a) In matters
- 8 related to operation of an open-enrollment charter school, an
- 9 open-enrollment charter school is immune [from liability] to the
- 10 same extent as a school district, and its employees and volunteers
- 11 are immune [from liability] to the same extent as school district
- 12 employees and volunteers. A member of the governing body of an
- 13 open-enrollment charter school or of a charter holder is immune
- 14 [from liability] to the same extent as a school district trustee.
- 15 (b) An open-enrollment charter school is a governmental
- 16 unit as defined by Section 101.001, Civil Practice and Remedies
- 17 Code, and is subject to liability only as provided by Chapter 101,
- 18 Civil Practice and Remedies Code, and only in the manner that
- 19 liability is provided by that chapter for a school district.
- 20 <u>(c) An open-enrollment charter school is a local government</u>
- 21 as defined by Section 102.001, Civil Practice and Remedies Code,
- 22 and a payment on a tort claim must comply with Chapter 102, Civil
- 23 Practice and Remedies Code.
- 24 (d) An open-enrollment charter school is a local

- 1 governmental entity as defined by Section 271.151, Local Government
- 2 Code, and is subject to liability on a contract as provided by
- 3 Subchapter I, Chapter 271, Local Government Code, and only in the
- 4 manner that liability is provided by that subchapter for a school
- 5 district.
- 6 SECTION 2. Subchapter D, Chapter 12, Education Code, is
- 7 amended by adding Section 12.1058 to read as follows:
- 8 Sec. 12.1058. APPLICABILITY OF OTHER LAWS. (a) Ar
- 9 open-enrollment charter school is considered to be:
- 10 (1) a local government for purposes of Chapter 791,
- 11 Government Code;
- 12 (2) a local government for purposes of Chapter 2259,
- 13 Government Code, except that an open-enrollment charter school may
- 14 not issue public securities as provided by Section 2259.031(b),
- 15 Government Code; and
- 16 (3) a political subdivision for purposes of Chapter
- 17 172, Local Government Code.
- 18 (b) An open-enrollment charter school may elect to extend
- 19 workers' compensation benefits to employees of the school through
- 20 any method available to a political subdivision under Chapter 504,
- 21 Labor Code. An open-enrollment charter school that elects to
- 22 <u>extend workers' compensation benefits as permitted under this</u>
- 23 section is considered to be a political subdivision for all
- 24 purposes under Chapter 504, Labor Code.
- 25 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 26 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 27 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this

- 1 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 2 Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
