5	SECTION 1. Section 401.011(b), Health and Safety Code, is

11	(2) the processing or storage of low-level radioactive

13	from other persons, except oil and gas NORM;
14	(3) the recovery or processing of source material in
15	accordance with Subchapter G;
16	(4) the processing of by-product material as defined
17	by Section 401.003(3)(B); and

- 20 (B) by-product material; or
- (C) naturally occurring radioactive material 21
- 22 waste, except as provided by Section 401.415(f).
- 23 SECTION 2. The heading to Section 401.415, Health and
- Safety Code, is amended to read as follows: 24

- 3 SECTION 3. Section 401.415, Health and Safety Code, is
- 4 amended by adding Subsection (f) to read as follows:
- 5 (f) Notwithstanding any other provision of this chapter,
- 6 Chapter 27, Water Code, or any other law, the Railroad Commission of
- 7 Texas has sole authority to regulate and issue licenses, permits,
- 8 and orders for the disposal in a bedded salt formation of naturally
- 9 occurring radioactive material waste resulting from the treatment
- 10 of drinking water.
- 11 SECTION 4. The Railroad Commission of Texas shall adopt
- 12 rules for the implementation of Section 401.415(f), Health and
- 13 Safety Code, as added by this Act, not later than January 1, 2012.
- SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
