A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to awards for certain members of the state military forces
- 3 who were inducted into or served in federal military service in
- 4 support of Operations Iraqi Freedom, New Dawn, and Enduring
- 5 Freedom.
- 6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 7 SECTION 1. Section 431.134(a), Government Code, is amended
- 8 to read as follows:
- 9 (a) The adjutant general may adopt rules and regulations
- 10 relating to the:
- 11 (1) Texas Faithful Service Medal, which shall be
- 12 awarded to a member of the state military forces who has completed
- 13 five years of honorable service during which the person has shown
- 14 fidelity to duty, efficient service, and great loyalty to the
- 15 state;
- 16 (2) Federal Service Medal, which shall be awarded to a
- 17 person who was inducted into federal service from the state
- 18 military forces between June 15, 1940, and January 1, 1946, or after
- 19 June 1, 1950, if the service was for more than 90 days;
- 20 (3) Texas Medal of Merit, which may be presented to a
- 21 member of the military forces of this state, another state, or the
- 22 United States who performs outstanding service or attains
- 23 extraordinary achievement in behalf of the state or United States;
- 24 (4) Texas Outstanding Service Medal, which may be

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- 1 presented to a member of the military forces of this state, another
- 2 state, or the United States who has performed service in a superior
- 3 and clearly outstanding manner;
- 4 (5) Texas State Guard Service Medal, which shall be
- 5 awarded to a person who completes three consecutive years of
- 6 honorable service in the Texas State Guard during which the person
- 7 has shown fidelity to duty, efficient service, and great loyalty to
- 8 the state;
- 9 (6) Texas Desert Shield/Desert Storm Campaign Medal,
- 10 which shall be awarded to a person who was inducted into federal
- 11 service from the Texas National Guard after August 1, 1990, in
- 12 support of Operation Desert Shield or Operation Desert Storm,
- 13 without regard to the place that the person was deployed while
- 14 serving on active federal military duty;
- 15 (7) Texas Humanitarian Service Medal, which shall be
- 16 awarded to a person who:
- 17 (A) does not meet the criteria for an award of the
- 18 federal Humanitarian Service Medal;
- 19 (B) is a member of the state military forces; and
- (C) while serving on state active duty or active
- 21 duty under state authority in accordance with Title 32 of the United
- 22 States Code, participates satisfactorily in defense support to a
- 23 mission under civilian authority to protect life or property during
- 24 or soon after a natural disaster or civil unrest in the state;
- 25 (8) Texas Cavalry Medal, which shall be awarded to a
- 26 person who:
- 27 (A) served on or after September 11, 2001, in the

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- 1 124th Cavalry, Texas Army National Guard; and
- 2 (B) served in a hostile fire zone as designated
- 3 by the United States secretary of defense;
- 4 (9) Texas Combat Service Ribbon, which shall be
- 5 awarded to a member of the Texas National Guard who served, after
- 6 September 11, 2001, in a hostile fire zone as designated by the
- 7 United States secretary of defense;
- 8 (10) Texas Purple Heart Medal, which shall be awarded
- 9 to a person who, after September 11, 2001:
- 10 (A) was inducted into federal service from the
- 11 Texas National Guard; and
- 12 (B) meets the criteria for an award of the
- 13 federal Purple Heart Medal;
- 14 (11) Texas Superior Service Medal, which shall be
- 15 awarded to:
- 16 (A) a member of the state military forces who
- 17 has:
- 18 (i) completed 30 or more years of honorable
- 19 state service or a combination of state and federal service; and
- 20 (ii) continually demonstrated superior
- 21 performance and service while assigned to key leadership positions
- 22 demanding responsibility; or
- 23 (B) a civilian who has contributed significant
- 24 service to the state military forces; [and]
- 25 (12) Texas Homeland Defense Service Medal, which shall
- 26 be awarded to a member of the state military forces who served:
- 27 (A) on or after September 11, 2001;

- 1 (B) on state active duty or active duty under
- 2 state authority in accordance with Title 32 of the United States
- 3 Code; and
- 4 (C) satisfactorily in defense support to a
- 5 mission in the state under civilian authority;
- 6 (13) Texas Iraqi Campaign Medal, which shall be
- 7 <u>awarded to a person who was inducted into federal military service</u>
- 8 from the Texas National Guard or to a member of the Texas National
- 9 Guard who served in federal military service, without regard to the
- 10 place that the person was deployed while serving on active federal
- 11 military duty, after:
- 12 (A) March 19, 2003, in support of Operation Iraqi
- 13 Freedom; or
- 14 (B) August 31, 2010, in support of Operation New
- 15 Dawn; and
- 16 (14) Texas Afghanistan Campaign Medal, which shall be
- 17 awarded to a person who was inducted into federal military service
- 18 from the Texas National Guard or to a member of the Texas National
- 19 Guard who served in federal military service after October 6, 2001,
- 20 in support of Operation Enduring Freedom, without regard to the
- 21 place that the person was deployed while serving on active federal
- 22 <u>military duty</u>.
- 23 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 24 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 25 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 26 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 27 Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
