| 4 | BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: |
| 5 | SECTION 1. Chapter 61, Education Code, is amended by adding |
| 6 | Subchapter I-1 to read as follows: |
| 7 | SUBCHAPTER I-1. PHYSICIAN RESIDENCY GRANTS |
| 8 | Sec. 61.511. PHYSICIAN RESIDENCY GRANT PROGRAM. (a) The |
| 9 | board shall establish and administer the physician residency grant |
| 10 | program to provide grants to accredited residency programs at |
| 11 | health care entities, including academic medical centers, |
| 12 | nonprofit community hospitals, county health systems, and |
| 13 | community health clinics, that apply to the board in the manner |
| 14 | prescribed by the board. The board shall establish reasonable |
| 15 | eligibility criteria for grant recipients as appropriate to achieve |
| 16 | the purposes of this subchapter. |
| 17 | (b) The board may provide grants only to support physiciar |
| | |

- 1 residency positions created on or after January 1, 2012. 18
- 19 (c) The board shall award grants to residency programs in
- the following order of priority: 20
- (1) programs offered by health care entities that are 21
- located in underserved communities; 22
- 23 (2) programs offered by health care entities that, for
- 24 the purpose of receiving matching funds, enter into partnership

- 1 agreements with other entities, including health care entities,
- 2 corporations, or community collaborative groups; and
- 3 (3) programs offered by health care entities that have
- 4 demonstrated an ability to maintain those programs over time.
- 5 (d) The board shall award grants for all residency positions
- 6 awarded a grant under this section in the preceding year before
- 7 awarding a grant for a residency position that did not receive a
- 8 grant in the preceding year.
- 9 (e) A grant received by a health care entity under this
- 10 section may be used only to:
- 11 (1) pay all or part of the salaries of resident
- 12 physicians in the appropriate programs; and
- 13 (2) supplement the salaries of teaching faculty and
- 14 program administrators.
- (f) For each residency position, the grant program may
- 16 provide funding of not more than \$65,000 each year for the resident
- 17 physician's salary and supplemental funding of not more than \$8,000
- 18 for the salaries of teaching faculty and program administrators.
- 19 The grant program may not provide funding for more than 420
- 20 residency positions each year.
- 21 (g) Under the grant program, the board shall:
- (1) provide funding to ensure that each resident
- 23 physician's salary is paid at a level that:
- 24 (A) is competitive with the salaries of other
- 25 resident physicians working within the same specialty in this
- 26 state; and
- 27 (B) as determined by the board, exceeds the

- 1 average statewide salary for resident physicians, other than
- 2 resident physicians whose salaries are funded under the grant
- 3 program; and
- 4 (2) make appropriate recommendations for legislative
- 5 changes as necessary, if the amounts described by Subsection (f)
- 6 are not sufficient for the purposes of this subsection.
- 7 (h) The board shall require the return of any unused grant
- 8 money by, or shall decline to award additional grants to, a
- 9 residency program that receives a grant but fails to create, within
- 10 <u>a reasonable period</u>, the number of residency positions proposed in
- 11 the program's grant application. The board may restore grant money
- 12 or award additional grants, as applicable, on the program's
- 13 creation of the proposed number of positions.
- 14 (i) The board shall adopt rules for the administration of
- 15 this section.
- SECTION 2. Section 61.0594, Education Code, is transferred
- 17 to Subchapter I-1, Chapter 61, Education Code, as added by this Act,
- 18 and redesignated as Section 61.512, Education Code, to read as
- 19 follows:
- Sec. 61.512 [61.0594]. COORDINATED FUNDING OF GRADUATE
- 21 MEDICAL EDUCATION. (a) The board shall administer a program to
- 22 support graduate medical education programs in this state
- 23 consistent with the needs of this state for graduate medical
- 24 education and the training of resident physicians in accredited
- 25 residency programs in appropriate fields and specialties,
- 26 including primary care specialties described by Section 58.008(a).
- (b) From money available to the program, the board may make

- 1 grants or formula distributions to:
- 2 (1) support appropriate graduate medical education
- 3 programs and activities for which adequate funds are not otherwise
- 4 available; or
- 5 (2) foster new or expanded graduate medical education
- 6 programs or activities that the board determines will address the
- 7 state's needs for graduate medical education.
- 8 (c) To be eligible to receive a grant or distribution under
- 9 this section, an institution or other entity must incur the costs of
- 10 faculty supervision and education or the stipend costs of resident
- 11 physicians in accredited clinical residency programs in this state.
- 12 In making grants and distributions under this section, the board
- 13 shall give consideration to the costs incurred by medical schools
- 14 or other entities to support faculty responsible for the education
- 15 or supervision of resident physicians in accredited graduate
- 16 medical education programs, including programs in osteopathic
- 17 medical education.
- 18 (d) The program is funded by appropriations, by gifts,
- 19 grants, and donations made to support the program, and by any other
- 20 funds the board obtains, including federal funds, for the program.
- 21 From program funds, the comptroller of public accounts shall issue
- 22 warrants to each institution or other entity determined by the
- 23 board as eligible to receive a grant or distribution from the
- 24 program in the amount certified by the board. An amount granted to
- 25 an institution or other entity under the program may be used only to
- 26 cover expenses of training residents of the particular program or
- 27 activity for which the award is made in accordance with any

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- 1 conditions imposed by the board and may not otherwise be expended
- 2 for the general support of the institution or entity.
- 3 (e) The board shall appoint an advisory committee to advise
- 4 the board regarding the development and administration of the
- 5 program, including considering requests for program grants and
- 6 establishing formulas for distribution of money under the program.
- 7 The advisory committee shall consist of:
- 8 (1) the executive director of the Texas State Board of
- 9 Medical Examiners or the executive director's designee;
- 10 (2) the chair of the Family Practice Residency
- 11 Advisory Committee or the chair's designee;
- 12 (3) the chair of the Primary Care Residency Advisory
- 13 Committee or the chair's designee;
- 14 (4) the commissioner of the Health and Human Services
- 15 Commission or the commissioner's designee; and
- 16 (5) the following members appointed by the board:
- 17 (A) one representative of a teaching hospital
- 18 affiliated with a Texas medical school;
- 19 (B) one representative of a teaching hospital not
- 20 affiliated with a Texas medical school;
- 21 (C) three representatives of medical schools, at
- 22 least one representing a medical school in The University of Texas
- 23 System, and at least one representing a medical school not in The
- 24 University of Texas System;
- (D) two physicians active in private practice,
- 26 one of whom must be a generalist;
- 27 (E) one doctor of osteopathic medicine active in

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- 1 private practice;
- 2 (F) one representative of an entity providing
- 3 managed health care;
- 4 (G) three clinical faculty members, at least one
- 5 of whom must be a generalist;
- 6 (H) one resident physician, who is a nonvoting
- 7 member; and
- 8 (I) one medical student, who is a nonvoting
- 9 member.
- 10 (f) The appointed advisory committee members serve
- 11 staggered three-year terms. The board shall make the initial
- 12 committee appointments to terms of one, two, and three years as
- 13 necessary so that one-third of the appointed members' terms expire
- 14 each year, as nearly as practicable. The committee shall elect one
- 15 of its members as presiding officer for a term of one year. The
- 16 committee shall meet at least once each year at the times requested
- 17 by the board or set by the presiding officer of the committee. A
- 18 member of the advisory committee may not be compensated for service
- 19 on the committee but is entitled to be reimbursed by the board for
- 20 actual expenses incurred in the performance of the member's duties
- 21 as a committee member.
- 22 (g) The advisory committee shall:
- 23 (1) review applications for funding of graduate
- 24 medical education programs under this section and make
- 25 recommendations for approval or disapproval of those applications;
- 26 (2) make recommendations relating to the standards and
- 27 criteria used for consideration and approval of grants or for the

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- 1 development of formulas for distribution of funding under this
- 2 section;
- 3 (3) recommend to the board an allocation of funds
- 4 among medical schools, teaching hospitals, and other entities that
- 5 may receive funds under this section; and
- 6 (4) perform other duties assigned by the board.
- 7 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
