(a) The Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board 8 9 shall establish an advisory committee to develop recommendations for the implementation of the tuition exemption for students 10 enrolled in courses offered as part of a fire science curriculum 11 offered under Section 54.208, as amended by Chapters 1285 (H.B. 12 2013) and 1299 (H.B. 2347), Acts of the 81st Legislature, Regular 13 14 Session, 2009, including a determination of the definition and scope of fire science curriculum. 15 16 (b) The advisory committee must be composed of members from institutions of higher education, experts in the fire sciences, and 17 firefighters. 18 19 (c) The advisory committee may request the cooperation and assistance of state agencies in preparing recommendations under 20 21 this section. (d) Not later than September 1, 2012, the advisory committee 22 23 shall issue a report of its recommendations to the lieutenant governor, the speaker of the house, each standing committee of the 24

3 (e) This section expires January 1, 2013.

4 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 5 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 6 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 7 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 8 Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
