The heading to Subchapter L, Chapter 411, 1-14 Government Code, is amended to read as follows: 1**-**15 1**-**16 SUBCHAPTER L. STATEWIDE AMERICA'S MISSING: BROADCAST EMERGENCY RESPONSE (AMBER) ALERT SYSTEM FOR ABDUCTED CHILDREN AND MISSING 1-17 PERSONS WITH INTELLECTUAL DISABILITIES SECTION 2. Section 411.351, Government Code, is amended by 1-18 1-19 amending Subdivisions (2) and (3) and adding Subdivisions (2-a) and 1-20 1-21 (3-a) to read as follows: (2) "Alert system" means the statewide America's Broadcast Emergency Response (AMBER) alert system for 1-22 Missing: 1-23 abducted children and missing persons with intellectual 1-24 disabilities. (2-a) "Intellectual disability" means significantly subaverage general intellectual functioning that is concurrent 1**-**25 1**-**26 with deficits in adaptive behavior and originates during the 1-27 1-28 developmental period. The term includes a pervasive developmental 1-29 <u>disorder.</u> (3) "Local law enforcement agency" means a local law enforcement agency with jurisdiction over the investigation of: 1-30 1-31 1-32 (A) the abduction of a child; or 1-33 (B) missing person with an intellectual а 1-34 disability. "Pervasive developmental disorder" 1-35 (3**-**a) mea<u>ns</u> а 1-36 that meets the criteria for a pervasive developmental disorder disorder established in the most recent Diagnostic and Statistical 1-37 Manual of Mental Disorders published by the American Psychiatric 1-38 1-39 Association. 1-40 SECTION 3. Section 411.352, Government Code, is amended to 1-41 read as follows: 1-42 Sec. 411.352. STATEWIDE AMERICA'S MISSING: BROADCAST EMERGENCY RESPONSE (AMBER) ALERT SYSTEM FOR ABDUCTED CHILDREN AND 1-43 MISSING PERSONS WITH INTELLECTUAL DISABILITIES. With the cooperation of the Texas Department of Transportation, the office 1-44 1-45 of the governor, and other appropriate law enforcement agencies in 1-46 1 - 47this state, the department shall develop and implement a statewide 1-48 alert system to be activated on behalf of an abducted child or a missing person with an intellectual disability. (b) On the request of a local law enforcement agency regarding a missing person with an intellectual disability, the department shall activate the alert system and notify appropriate 2**-**15 2**-**16 2-17 2-18 participants in the alert system, as established by rule, if: (1) the local law enforcement agency receives notice of a missing person with an intellectual disability; (2) the local law enforcement agency verifies that at 2-19 2-20 2-21 the time the person is reported missing: 2-22 (A) the person has an intellectual disability, 2-23 determined according to the procedure provided by Section 593.005, 2-24 2**-**25 2**-**26 Health and Safety Code; and (B) the person's location is unknown; the local law enforcement agency determines that 2-27 (3) the person's disappearance poses a credible threat to the person's 2-28 2-29 health and safety; and (4) sufficient information is available to disseminate to the public that could assist in locating the person. 2-30 to 2-31 2-32 (c) The department may modify the criteria described by 2-33 Subsection (a) or (b) as necessary for the proper implementation of 2-34 the alert system. 2-35 SECTION 5. Section 411.356, Government Code, is amended to 2-36 read as follows: 2-37 Sec. 411.356. LOCAL LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCIES. Before 2-38 requesting activation of the alert system, a local law enforcement agency must verify that the criteria described by Section 411.355(a) or (b), as applicable, have been satisfied.
