## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to a requirement of a commitment to serve a certain minimum
3	term before a person may be appointed as a member of a local school
4	health advisory council.
5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. Section 28.004(d), Education Code, is amended to
7	read as follows:
8	(d) The board of trustees shall appoint at least five
9	members to the local school health advisory council. A person may
10	be appointed as a member of the council only if, before appointment,
11	the person agrees to serve for at least two years. A majority of the
12	members must be persons who are parents of students enrolled in the
13	district and who are not employed by the district. One of those
14	members shall serve as chair or co-chair of the council. The board
15	of trustees also may appoint one or more persons from each of the
16	following groups or a representative from a group other than a group
17	specified under this subsection:
18	(1) public school teachers;
19	(2) public school administrators;
20	(3) district students;
21	(4) health care professionals;
22	(5) the business community;
23	(6) law enforcement;

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(7) senior citizens;

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- 1 (8) the clergy; and
- 2 (9) nonprofit health organizations.

3 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 4 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 5 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 6 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this

7 Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
