- by 38 U.S.C. Section 101(16), and who has suffered the effects of 14
- discriminatory practices or other similar insidious circumstances 15
- 16 over which the person has no control.
- 17 SECTION 2. Section 2161.125, Government Code, is amended to
- read as follows: 18
- Sec. 2161.125. CATEGORIZATION 19 OF HISTORICALLY
- UNDERUTILIZED BUSINESSES [BY SEX, RACE, AND ETHNICITY]. The 20
- comptroller, in cooperation with each state agency reporting under 21
- this subchapter, shall categorize each historically underutilized 22
- 23 business included in a report under this subchapter by sex, race,
- and ethnicity and by whether the business qualifies as a 2.4

- 1 <u>historically underutilized business because it is owned or owned</u>,
- 2 operated, and controlled, as applicable, wholly or partly by one or
- 3 more veterans as defined by 38 U.S.C. Section 101(2) who have a
- 4 service-connected disability as defined by 38 U.S.C. Section
- 5 101(16).
- 6 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
