A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

2 relating to the accommodation of pedestrians, bicyclists, persons 3 with disabilities, children, senior citizens, users of public 4 transportation, movers of commercial goods, and motorists on 5 streets and highways.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

7 SECTION 1. (a) The Texas Department of Transportation 8 shall consider the needs of motorists, public transportation 9 vehicles, users of public transportation, bicyclists, and 10 pedestrians of all ages and abilities in all transportation 11 planning, design, construction, reconstruction, retrofitting, 12 operations, and maintenance.

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(b) The Texas Department of Transportation shall:

14 (1) view all transportation improvements as 15 opportunities to improve safety, access, air quality, and mobility 16 for all travelers in Texas; and

17 (2) recognize that bicycle, pedestrian, and transit18 modes are integral elements of the transportation system.

SECTION 2. Subchapter H, Chapter 201, Transportation Code,
 is amended by adding Section 201.622 to read as follows:

21 <u>Sec. 201.622. COMPLETE STREETS POLICY. (a) In this</u>
22 <u>section:</u>
23 (1) "Complete streets policy" means a written policy

24 <u>that</u>:

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C.S.H.B. No. 1105 (A) provides guidelines for addressing the 1 2 safety, accessibility, and mobility of users of streets and highways, including pedestrians, bicyclists, persons with 3 disabilities, children, senior citizens, users of public 4 transportation, movers of commercial goods, and motorists, in the 5 planning, design, construction, and maintenance of streets and 6 7 highways; and 8 (B) recognizes that the needs of users of streets and highways vary according to the urban, rural, or suburban 9 10 context. (2) "Local authority" means a county, municipality, or 11 12 other local entity authorized to plan, design, construct, and maintain streets and highways. 13 14 (b) The commission shall adopt a complete streets policy. 15 (c) The commission, in adopting a complete streets policy under Subsection (b), shall consider best practices and guidance 16 17 from: (1) the United States Department of Transportation 18 19 Federal Highway Administration; (2) the American Association of State Highway and 20 Transportation Officials; 21 22 (3) the National Association of City Transportation 23 Officials; 24 (4) the Texas Manual on Uniform Traffic Control 25 Devices; 26 (5) the Americans with Disabilities Act Accessibility 27 Guidelines;

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1	(6) the Public Rights-of-Way Accessibility
2	Guidelines; and
3	(7) the recommended practice titled "Designing
4	Walkable Urban Thoroughfares: A Context Sensitive Approach,"
5	issued by the Institute of Transportation Engineers.
6	(d) The commission shall ensure that the following comply
7	with the complete streets policy:
8	(1) transportation planning, design, construction,
9	and reconstruction; and
10	(2) improvements to streets, highways, and other
11	projects that fall under the commission's jurisdiction.
12	(e) A local authority shall ensure that all transportation
13	planning, design, construction, and reconstruction, street or
14	highway improvements, and access roads, bicycle paths, and
15	sidewalks to public transportation comply with the complete streets
16	policy if federal or state funds are used.
17	(f) To the extent consistent with federal law, a
18	metropolitan planning organization shall ensure that any
19	transportation improvement plan complies with the complete streets
20	policy.
21	(g) This section does not apply to a transportation project
22	<u>if:</u>
23	<u>(1) use of a particular street or highway by</u>
24	bicyclists or pedestrians is prohibited by law, including within
25	interstate highway corridors;
26	(2) the cost to comply with the complete streets
27	policy would be excessively disproportionate to the present or

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future need or probable use of the particular street or highway; or 1 2 (3) a sparseness of population indicates an absence of 3 future need. 4 (h) An exemption under Subsection (g) must be: 5 (1) approved by the department or local authority, as appropriate; and 6 (2) supported by publicly available documentation. 7 8 (i) The department or local authority, as appropriate, shall certify that each transportation project complies with the 9 complete streets policy in all aspects of project development. No 10 additional certification is required unless the scope of the 11 transportation project changes. 12

SECTION 3. The Texas Transportation 13 Commission shall 14 publish a best practices report not later than July 1, 2014. The 15 report must describe how the Texas Department of Transportation, local authorities, and metropolitan planning organizations have 16 17 changed their procedures to implement the complete streets policy required under Section 201.622, Transportation Code, as added by 18 The commission shall include a list of transportation 19 this Act. projects exempted under Section 201.622(g), Transportation Code, 20 as added by this Act, in the best practices report. The commission, 21 in publishing a best practices report under this section, shall 22 23 consider:

24 (1) procedures for identifying the needs of users of25 all ages and abilities;

26 (2) the types and designs of facilities needed to 27 serve the needs of users described by Subdivision (1) of this

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1 section;

2 (3) measures of effectiveness that document the 3 results of implementing Section 201.622, Transportation Code, as 4 added by this Act, on transportation projects under the 5 commission's jurisdiction; and

6 (4) procedures for identifying and overcoming 7 barriers to implementing the complete streets policy required under 8 Section 201.622, Transportation Code, as added by this Act.

9 SECTION 4. Section 201.622, Transportation Code, as added 10 by this Act, does not apply to a roadway project if a draft 11 Environmental Impact Statement, Environmental Assessment, or 12 Environmental Reevaluation for the roadway project is submitted to 13 the regulatory agency in accordance with the National Environmental 14 Policy Act before September 1, 2011.

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SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
