5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. The heading to Section 32.0248, Human Resources
7	Code, is amended to read as follows:
8	Sec. 32.0248. DEMONSTRATION PROJECT FOR PREVENTIVE
9	[WOMEN'S] HEALTH [CARE] SERVICES.
10	SECTION 2. Section 32.0248, Human Resources Code, is
11	amended by amending Subsections (a), (b), (c), (e), (g), and (i) and
12	adding Subsections (b-1) and (b-2) to read as follows:
13	(a) The department shall operate [establish] a [five-year]
14	demonstration project through the medical assistance program to
15	expand access to preventive health and family planning services
16	[for women]. A person [woman] eligible [under Subsection (b)] to
17	participate in the demonstration project may receive appropriate
18	preventive health and family planning services, including:
19	(1) medical history recording and evaluation;

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(3) health screenings, including screening for:

(2) physical examinations;

(A) diabetes;

(B) cervical cancer;

(C) breast cancer;

1	(D) sexually transmitted diseases;
2	(E) hypertension;
3	(F) cholesterol; and
4	(G) tuberculosis;
5	(4) counseling and education on contraceptive methods
6	emphasizing the health benefits of abstinence from sexual activity
7	to recipients who are not married, except for counseling and
8	education regarding emergency contraception;
9	(5) provision of contraceptives, except for the
10	provision of emergency contraception;
11	(6) risk assessment; and
12	(7) referral of medical problems to appropriate
13	providers that are entities or organizations that do not perform or
14	promote elective abortions or contract or affiliate with entities
15	that perform or promote elective abortions.
16	(b) A <u>person</u> [woman] is eligible to participate in the
17	demonstration project if the <u>person</u> [woman is at least 18 years of
18	age and]:
19	(1) has a net family income that is at or below 185
20	percent of the federal poverty level and:
21	(A) is at least 18 years of age; or
22	(B) is younger than 18 years of age and has given
23	birth while receiving benefits under the medical assistance
24	<pre>program;</pre>
25	(2) <u>is a woman who is at least 18 years of age and</u>
26	participates in or receives benefits under any of the following:

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(A) the medical assistance program;

- 1 (B) the financial assistance program under
- 2 Chapter 31;
- 3 (C) the nutritional assistance program under
- 4 Chapter 33;
- 5 (D) the Supplemental Food Program for Women,
- 6 Infants and Children; or
- 7 (E) another program administered by the state
- 8 that:
- 9 (i) requires documentation of income; and
- 10 (ii) restricts eligibility to persons with
- 11 income equal to or less than the income eligibility guidelines
- 12 applicable to the medical assistance program;
- 13 (3) <u>is a woman who is at least 18 years of age and</u> is
- 14 presumed eligible for one of the programs listed in Subdivision (2)
- 15 pending completion of that program's eligibility process; [ex]
- 16 (4) is a woman who is at least 18 years of age and is a
- 17 member of a family that contains at least one person who

- 20 (5) is a woman who is not pregnant but who, if she were
- 21 to become pregnant, would have a net family income on the birth of

- 24 (b-1) The department shall identify women potentially
- 25 eligible for participation in the demonstration project following
- 26 pregnancies for which the women received benefits through the
- 27 medical assistance program and assist those women in establishing

- 1 eligibility for the demonstration project immediately after their
- 2 eligibility for postpartum coverage under the medical assistance
- 3 program terminates.
- 4 (b-2) The department shall modify any applicable
- 5 administrative procedures to ensure that to the extent possible a
- 6 woman described by Subsection (b-1) maintains continuous
- 7 eligibility for any services provided by both the medical
- 8 assistance program and the demonstration project during the
- 9 transition from participation in the medical assistance program to
- 10 participation in the demonstration project.
- 11 (c) The department shall ensure that the standards of care
- 12 provided to a person [woman] participating in the demonstration
- 13 project are consistent with the requirements of law and current
- 14 best practices for provision of public health services.
- 15 (e) The department shall compile a list of potential funding
- 16 sources a person [woman] participating in the demonstration project
- 17 may be able to use to help pay for treatment for health problems:
- 18 (1) identified using services provided under the
- 19 demonstration project; and
- 20 (2) for which the <u>person</u> [woman] is not eligible to
- 21 receive treatment under the medical assistance program or the
- 22 demonstration project.
- 23 (g) Not later than December 1 of each even-numbered year,
- 24 the department shall submit a report to the legislature regarding
- 25 the department's operation of [progress in establishing and
- 26 operating | the demonstration project.
- 27 (i) This section expires September 1, 2014 [$\frac{2011}{2}$].

- 1 SECTION 3. Subchapter B, Chapter 32, Human Resources Code,
- 2 is amended by adding Section 32.02481 to read as follows:
- 3 Sec. 32.02481. PREVENTIVE HEALTH PROGRAM OUTREACH. (a) In
- 4 this section, "preventive health and family planning program" means
- 5 the demonstration project established under Section 32.0248.
- 6 (b) The department shall develop and implement an outreach
- 7 program to assist women described by Section 32.0248(b-1) in
- 8 establishing eligibility for the preventive health and family
- 9 planning program. As part of the outreach program, the department
- 10 <u>shall:</u>
- 11 (1) perform an initial screening to determine
- 12 eligibility for the preventive health and family planning program;
- 13 and
- 14 (2) ensure that a woman described by Section
- 15 32.0248(b-1) receives information regarding benefits available
- 16 through the preventive health and family planning program,
- 17 notification of potential eligibility, an application form for the
- 18 preventive health and family planning program, information on where
- 19 and how to receive application assistance, and a list, updated on a
- 20 quarterly basis, of preventive health and family planning program
- 21 providers in the woman's county of residence.
- (c) Information required under Subsection (b)(2) may be
- 23 <u>included in other mailings regularly sent to recipients, including</u>
- 24 a letter informing a recipient of the recipient's eligibility for
- 25 medical assistance.
- 26 (d) A hospital or health plan participating in the outreach
- 27 program that contracts with an entity that provides information and

- 1 services to participants in the medical assistance program may
- 2 modify the information and services provided by that entity to
- 3 ensure that potentially eligible women are provided the information
- 4 and services required under this section.
- 5 (e) The outreach program must include monitoring,
- 6 evaluation, and reporting. The department shall use information
- 7 provided by hospitals or health plans participating in the outreach
- 8 program to report to the legislature regarding:
- 9 <u>(1) the costs and benefits of establishing the</u>
- 10 outreach program; and
- 11 (2) problems encountered during the implementation
- 12 and operation of the outreach program and recommendations for
- 13 solutions.
- 14 SECTION 4. The change in law made by this Act applies to a
- 15 person who receives medical assistance under Chapter 32, Human
- 16 Resources Code, on or after the effective date of this Act,
- 17 regardless of the date on which eligibility for the medical
- 18 assistance was determined.
- 19 SECTION 5. If before implementing Section 32.0248, Human
- 20 Resources Code, as amended by this Act, a state agency determines
- 21 that an amendment to the existing waiver or other authorization is
- 22 necessary to extend the operation and scope of the demonstration
- 23 project under that section as amended, the agency affected by the
- 24 provision shall request the amendment to the waiver or other
- 25 authorization and may delay implementing that section until the
- 26 amendment or other authorization is granted.
- 27 SECTION 6. This Act takes effect August 31, 2011.
