2-27 located may impose a tax as provided by Subsection (a). A tax 2-28 imposed under this subsection does not apply to a hotel located in a municipality that imposes a tax under Chapter 351 applicable to the 2-29 2-30 hotel.

2-31 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 2-32 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 2-33 2-34 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 2-35 Act takes effect September 1, 2011.

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
