- 9 (a) A toll project entity may not enter into a comprehensive

- 12 (b) A toll project entity shall pay a nonrefundable

- 3 SECTION 2. The examination fee prescribed by Section
- 4 371.051, Transportation Code, as amended by this Act, applies only
- 5 to a comprehensive development agreement submitted to the office of
- 6 the attorney general on or after the effective date of this Act.
- 7 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 8 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 9 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 10 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 11 Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
