A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to policies, procedures, and training to address bullying
3	of public school students.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Section 25.0342(a), Education Code, is amended
6	to read as follows:
7	(a) In this section, "bullying" has the meaning assigned by
8	Section 37.0832 [means engaging in written or verbal expression or
9	physical conduct that a school district board of trustees or the
10	board's designee determines:
11	[(1) will have the effect of physically harming a
12	student, damaging a student's property, or placing a student in
13	reasonable fear of harm to the student's person or of damage to the
14	student's property; or
15	[(2) is sufficiently severe, persistent, or pervasive
16	enough that the action or threat creates an intimidating,
17	threatening, or abusive educational environment for a student].
18	SECTION 2. Section 37.001(b), Education Code, is amended to
19	read as follows:
20	(b) In this section:

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bodily injury to another student, engaging in sexually intimidating

"Bullying" has the meaning assigned by Section

(2) "Harassment" means threatening to cause harm or

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- 1 conduct, causing physical damage to the property of another
- 2 student, subjecting another student to physical confinement or
- 3 restraint, or maliciously taking any action that substantially
- 4 harms another student's physical or emotional health or safety.
- 5 (3) $\left[\frac{(2)}{(2)}\right]$ "Hit list" means a list of people targeted
- 6 to be harmed, using:
- 7 (A) a firearm, as defined by Section 46.01(3),
- 8 Penal Code;
- 9 (B) a knife, as defined by Section 46.01(7),
- 10 Penal Code; or
- 11 (C) any other object to be used with intent to
- 12 cause bodily harm.
- SECTION 3. Section 37.083(a), Education Code, is amended to
- 14 read as follows:
- 15 (a) Each school district shall adopt and implement a
- 16 discipline management program to be included in the district
- 17 improvement plan under Section 11.252. The program must provide
- 18 for prevention of and education concerning unwanted physical or
- 19 verbal aggression $\underline{and}[\tau]$ sexual harassment[τ and other forms of
- 20 bullying in school, on school grounds, and in school vehicles.
- SECTION 4. Subchapter C, Chapter 37, Education Code, is
- 22 amended by adding Section 37.0832 to read as follows:
- Sec. 37.0832. BULLYING, INCLUDING CYBERBULLYING: POLICIES,
- 24 PROCEDURES, AND TRAINING. (a) In this section:
- 25 (1) "Bullying":
- 26 (A) means engaging in written or verbal
- 27 expression or physical conduct, including an action motivated by a

- 1 perceived imbalance of power based on another student's actual or
- 2 perceived personal characteristics, behavior, beliefs, or
- 3 citizenship status or by another student's association with a third
- 4 person and based on the third person's characteristics, behavior,
- 5 beliefs, or citizenship status, that:
- 6 (i) has the effect or will have the effect
- 7 of physically harming a student, damaging a student's property, or
- 8 placing a student in reasonable fear of harm to the student's person
- 9 or of damage to the student's property;
- 10 <u>(ii)</u> is sufficiently severe, persistent, or
- 11 pervasive enough that the action or threat creates an intimidating,
- 12 threatening, or abusive educational environment for a student;
- 13 <u>(iii) interferes with a student's</u>
- 14 educational opportunities; or
- (iv) substantially disrupts the orderly
- 16 operation of a school; and
- 17 (B) includes cyberbullying.
- 18 (2) "Cyberbullying" means bullying that is done using
- 19 electronic communication, including electronic media.
- 20 (b) This section applies to bullying that:
- 21 (1) occurs on or is delivered to school property or to
- 22 the site of a school-sponsored or school-related activity on or off
- 23 school property; or
- 24 (2) occurs off school property or outside of a
- 25 <u>school-sponsored</u> or <u>school-related</u> activity, if the conduct
- 26 interferes with a student's educational opportunities or
- 27 substantially disrupts the orderly operation of a school or

- 1 school-sponsored or school-related activity.
- 2 (c) The board of trustees of each school district shall
- 3 adopt a policy concerning bullying that:
- 4 (1) prohibits bullying of a student;
- 5 (2) prohibits retaliation against any person,
- 6 including a victim, a witness, or another person, who in good faith
- 7 provides information concerning an incident of bullying;
- 8 (3) provides for the appropriate intervention for a
- 9 student who engages in bullying or falsely accuses another of
- 10 bullying;
- 11 (4) requires each school principal or the principal's
- 12 designee to develop a campus strategy for protecting each campus
- 13 student from being bullied or related retaliation that includes
- 14 imposing appropriate discipline to reduce the risk of incidents of
- 15 bullying and offering appropriate assistance to a victim of
- 16 bullying or a student engaging in bullying;
- 17 (5) establishes a procedure for reporting an incident
- 18 of bullying within a district and on each district campus that
- 19 specifies the action a student should take in case of bullying; and
- 20 (6) addresses any other issue concerning bullying that
- 21 the board of trustees determines to be appropriate.
- 22 (d) The procedure under Subsection (c)(5):
- 23 (1) must enable a student to report an incident of
- 24 bullying to any school district employee;
- 25 (2) must require the posting of a list on each campus
- 26 that identifies each person who has special training or designation
- 27 to receive a report of an incident of bullying;

1 (3) may establish an anonymous reporting system; and

2 (4) may include any other provision concerning

reporting an incident of bullying that the board of trustees 3

determines to be appropriate.

4 5 (e) Except as otherwise provided by this subsection, not later than the second school day after the date a school principal 6 7 acquires knowledge of an incident of bullying, the school district superintendent or the superintendent's designee shall, by 8 telephone or electronic communication, provide notice of the 9 incident to the parent or guardian of the victim of the alleged 10 bullying and the parent or guardian of the student who allegedly 11 12 engaged in the bullying. In accordance with a policy adopted by the district board of trustees, the superintendent or the 13 14 superintendent's designee may notify other persons, 15 appropriate. If the superintendent or the superintendent's designee is not successful in reaching a parent or guardian by 16 17 telephone or electronic communication, the superintendent or the superintendent's designee shall contact the parent or guardian in 18 writing as soon as practicable. The principal shall inform a victim 19 of bullying of the victim's right to request that the victim's 20 parent or guardian not be notified of the incident. On a request 21 from a victim, the principal shall request the superintendent or 22 the superintendent's designee to grant a waiver from the 23 24 notification requirement under this subsection. Granting or denial of the waiver is at the sole discretion of the superintendent or the 25 26 superintendent's designee, must be based on the facts of the case, and must be documented in writing. Granting a waiver under this 27

- 1 subsection does not relieve a district employee of any other duty
- 2 imposed by the policy adopted under Subsection (c).
- 3 (f) Each school district shall provide annual written
- 4 notice of the policy adopted under Subsection (c) and the
- 5 notification requirements under Subsection (e) to each district
- 6 student, the parent or guardian of each district student, and each
- 7 district employee or volunteer. The notice must be posted on the
- 8 district's Internet website and at each district campus in the
- 9 cafeteria, on each major bulletin board, in a prominent place in the
- 10 area of campus administrative offices, and at any other appropriate
- 11 location determined by the school principal. The policy also must
- 12 be included in each student and employee handbook.
- 13 (g) Each school district shall provide the following
- 14 training concerning bullying:
- 15 (1) annual training in preventing, identifying,
- 16 responding to, and reporting incidents of bullying for district
- 17 administrators and for other district employees and volunteers who
- 18 have significant contact with students;
- 19 (2) instruction to district students regarding the
- 20 elements of bullying; and
- 21 (3) an educational program for district students and
- 22 the parents and guardians of district students in preventing,
- 23 identifying, responding to, and reporting incidents of bullying.
- SECTION 5. This Act applies beginning with the 2011-2012
- 25 school year.
- 26 SECTION 6. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 27 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as

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- 1 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 2 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 3 Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
