- 2 relating to the authority of peace officers to request fingerprints
- 3 during motor vehicle stops.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Chapter 2, Code of Criminal Procedure, is
- 6 amended by adding Article 2.32 to read as follows:
- 7 Art. 2.32. OBTAINING FINGERPRINTS DURING MOTOR VEHICLE
- 8 STOP. (a) In this article:
- 9 <u>(1) "Citation" means any summons, ticket, or other</u>
- 10 official document issued to a person by a peace officer that
- 11 requires the person to respond or appear.
- 12 (2) "Motor vehicle stop" means an occasion in which a
- 13 peace officer stops a motor vehicle based on the officer's
- 14 reasonable suspicion of an alleged violation of a law or ordinance.
- 15 (b) For purposes of accurately determining the person's
- 16 identity, a peace officer who makes a motor vehicle stop may request
- 17 and obtain one digital fingerprint from each hand of the person
- 18 operating the motor vehicle if the person operating the motor
- 19 <u>vehicle fails to provide to the officer during the stop:</u>
- 20 <u>(1) a driver's license issued to the person under</u>
- 21 Chapter 521 or 522, Transportation Code;
- 22 (2) a driver's license or commercial driver's license
- 23 <u>issued to the person by another state;</u>
- 24 (3) a United States passport issued to the person; or

- 1 (4) any other form of photographic identification
- 2 issued to the person by a governmental entity.
- 3 (c) In addition to or instead of the digital fingerprints
- 4 permitted under Subsection (b), the peace officer may request and
- 5 obtain one ink fingerprint from each hand of the person if the
- 6 requirements of Subsection (b) are otherwise met and the officer
- 7 issues a citation to the person for any offense as part of the motor
- 8 vehicle stop. An ink fingerprint must be placed on an area of the
- 9 citation that can be detached from the citation without damaging or
- 10 altering any information on the citation.
- 11 (d) The person operating the motor vehicle shall provide the
- 12 person's fingerprints on a request by the peace officer under
- 13 Subsection (b) or (c).
- (e) Subject to Subsection (f), the peace officer and the
- 15 applicable law enforcement agency may retain a digital or ink
- 16 fingerprint under this article beyond the duration of the motor
- 17 vehicle stop only if the person operating the motor vehicle is cited
- 18 or arrested for an offense during or as a result of the stop.
- 19 (f) A digital or ink fingerprint taken under this article
- 20 must be discarded not later than the 30th day after the date the
- 21 custodian of the fingerprint receives proof from any source that
- 22 each criminal charge relating to the person's citation or arrest
- 23 has been resolved as follows:
- 24 (1) the charge was dismissed with prejudice against
- 25 the state;
- 26 (2) the person was acquitted of the charge; or
- 27 (3) the person was convicted of an offense punishable

- 1 by fine only or the charge based on such an offense was dismissed
- 2 for any reason.
- 3 (g) Based on available information regarding the retention
- 4 of a fingerprint under Subsection (e), a court shall make a good
- 5 faith effort to notify each custodian of the defendant's
- 6 fingerprints as soon as practicable after the occurrence of any
- 7 disposition of the defendant's case by the court as described by
- 8 Subsection (f).
- 9 (h) This article does not prevent a peace officer from
- 10 obtaining fingerprints through a person's voluntary compliance
- 11 with the peace officer's request for fingerprints or through any
- 12 other lawful means.
- 13 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 14 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 15 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 16 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 17 Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
