A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT

- 2 relating to the selection of candidates for the State Board of
- 3 Education through a unitary primary election.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Chapter 172, Election Code, is amended by adding
- 6 Subchapter F to read as follows:

7 SUBCHAPTER F. USE OF UNITARY PRIMARY

- 8 Sec. 172.201. APPLICABILITY OF SUBCHAPTER. This subchapter
- 9 applies only to the election of a member of the State Board of
- 10 Education.
- 11 Sec. 172.202. CONFLICTS. To the extent of any conflict
- 12 between this subchapter and another provision of this code with
- 13 regard to an office to which this subchapter applies, this
- 14 subchapter controls.
- 15 Sec. 172.203. UNITARY PRIMARY REQUIRED. (a) Instead of
- 16 following the primary process established by the other subchapters
- of this chapter, the nominating process established by Chapter 181,
- 18 the independent candidacy provisions of Chapter 142, or the
- 19 write-in candidacy provisions of Subchapter B, Chapter 146, all
- 20 candidates for an office to which this subchapter applies must
- 21 appear on the unitary primary election ballot and face election at
- 22 the unitary primary election established under this subchapter.
- (b) A political party may not make a nomination for an
- 24 office elected at the unitary primary election.

- 1 Sec. 172.204. APPLICATION REQUIRED. (a) To be entitled to
- 2 a place on the unitary primary election ballot, a candidate must
- 3 make an application for a place on the ballot.
- 4 (b) In addition to complying with Section 141.031, an
- 5 application must:
- 6 (1) state the party preference of the candidate or
- 7 state that the candidate is running as an independent candidate;
- 8 and
- 9 (2) be accompanied by:
- 10 (A) a filing fee in the amount prescribed by
- 11 Section 172.024 as if the office did appear on the general primary
- 12 election ballot; or
- 13 (B) a petition that satisfies the requirements
- 14 prescribed by Section 141.062 and contains at least the number of
- 15 signatures prescribed by Section 172.025 to appear on the petition
- 16 of a candidate as if the office did appear on the general primary
- 17 election ballot.
- 18 (c) A person is eligible to sign a petition under Subsection
- 19 (b)(2)(B) regardless of the person's affiliation with a political
- 20 party, and the person's signature on the petition does not affect
- 21 the person's ability to affiliate with or participate in the
- 22 affairs of a political party.
- Sec. 172.205. AUTHORITY WITH WHOM APPLICATION FILED:
- 24 DISPOSITION OF FILING FEE. (a) An application for a place on the
- 25 unitary primary election ballot must be filed during the period
- 26 prescribed by Section 172.023 with the secretary of state.
- 27 (b) A filing fee received by the secretary of state shall be

- 1 deposited in the general revenue fund.
- 2 Sec. 172.206. PREPARATION OF BALLOT FOR PRIMARY ELECTION.
- 3 (a) The county clerk shall prepare the ballot for the unitary
- 4 primary election.
- 5 (b) The secretary of state shall certify the name of each
- 6 candidate who has filed an application for a place on the ballot
- 7 that complies with the requirements as to form, content, and
- 8 procedure that the application must satisfy for the candidate's
- 9 name to be placed on the ballot.
- 10 <u>(c) For each office that is to appear on the ballot, the</u>
- 11 clerk shall list the name of each candidate certified under
- 12 Subsection (b) and include next to the name the candidate's party
- 13 preference or independent status as designated on the application
- 14 under Section 172.204(b)(1).
- Sec. 172.207. CONDUCT OF UNITARY PRIMARY ELECTION. (a) The
- 16 unitary primary election is held in conjunction with the general
- 17 primary election. Each political party holding a primary election
- 18 shall also provide a separate ballot for the unitary primary
- 19 election. Any eligible voter may vote in the unitary primary
- 20 election, and a person who votes only in the unitary primary
- 21 election does not become affiliated with a political party.
- 22 (b) Write-in voting is not permitted in the unitary primary
- 23 election.
- Sec. 172.208. CANVASS; RESULTS OF PRIMARY ELECTION. (a) In
- 25 the manner provided by Chapter 67:
- 26 (1) the local canvass shall be conducted by the
- 27 commissioners court of each county; and

- 1 (2) the state canvass shall be conducted by the
- 2 governor.
- 3 (b) For each office that appears on the unitary primary
- 4 election ballot, the authority that conducts the final canvass for
- 5 that office shall certify to the county clerk for inclusion on the
- 6 ballot for the general election for state and county officers the
- 7 names of the candidate who received the greatest number of votes and
- 8 the candidate who received the second greatest number of votes.
- 9 Sec. 172.209. PREPARATION OF BALLOT FOR GENERAL ELECTION.
- 10 (a) Offices for which a unitary primary election was held shall
- 11 appear on the ballot for the general election for state and county
- 12 officers:
- 13 (1) following the offices for which nominees are
- 14 chosen at primary elections or conventions; and
- 15 (2) under a heading that indicates the candidates for
- 16 office were chosen at the unitary primary election and a statement
- 17 that indicates a straight-party vote is not tallied for those
- 18 offices.
- 19 (b) For each office for which a unitary primary election was
- 20 held, the county clerk shall place on the ballot the name of each
- 21 candidate certified under Section 172.208(b) and the party
- 22 preference or independent status that the candidate provided on the
- 23 application under Section 172.204(b)(1).
- Sec. 172.210. CONDUCT OF GENERAL ELECTION. (a) At the
- 25 general election for state and county officers:
- 26 (1) write-in voting is not permitted for an office for
- 27 which a unitary primary election was held; and

- 1 (2) a straight-party vote is not tallied for an office
- 2 for which a unitary primary election was held.
- 3 (b) Subchapter C, Chapter 145, applies to a candidate in the
- 4 general election for state and county officers.
- 5 Sec. 172.211. VACANCY FILLED BY SPECIAL ELECTION. (a) This
- 6 section applies only to a vacancy in office to which this subchapter
- 7 <u>applies:</u>
- 8 <u>(1) that is required to be filled under Section</u>
- 9 202.002 at the next general election for state and county officers;
- 10 <u>and</u>
- 11 (2) that occurs after the 62nd day before general
- 12 primary election day.
- 13 (b) The election to fill the vacancy shall be held in the
- 14 same manner as a special election to fill a vacancy in the
- 15 legislature except that:
- 16 (1) the election shall be held on the date of the
- 17 general election for state and county officers;
- 18 (2) Section 203.013 does not apply; and
- 19 (3) write-in voting is not permitted.
- Sec. 172.212. RULES. The secretary of state shall adopt
- 21 rules as necessary to implement this subchapter.
- 22 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
