- SECTION 2. Section 46.035, Penal Code, is amended by adding
- 21 Subsection (h-2) to read as follows:
- 22 (h-2) It is a defense to prosecution under Subsections
- 23 (b)(1), (2), and (4)-(6), and (c) that at the time of the commission
- 24 of the offense, the actor was a person who, on September 1, 2011,

- 1 was serving as a member of the legislature and possessed a concealed
- 2 handgun license under Subchapter H, Chapter 411, Government Code,
- 3 if the person is no longer a member at the time of the offense and if
- 4 the license has not yet been subject to renewal since the person
- 5 ceased to be a member. This subsection expires on September 1,
- 6 2020.
- 7 SECTION 3. The change in law made by this Act applies only
- 8 to an offense committed on or after the effective date of this Act.
- 9 An offense committed before the effective date of this Act is
- 10 governed by the law in effect on the date the offense was committed,
- 11 and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose. For
- 12 purposes of this section, an offense was committed before the
- 13 effective date of this Act if any element of the offense occurred
- 14 before that date.
- 15 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
