A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to allowing military voters on active duty overseas to
3	receive and cast a ballot electronically.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Chapter 101, Election Code, is amended by adding
6	Section 101.0072 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 101.0072. ELECTRONIC TRANSMISSION OF BALLOTS TO AND
8	FROM OVERSEAS MILITARY PERSONNEL. (a) The secretary of state shall
9	prescribe procedures to allow the electronic transmission of
10	balloting materials to, and the electronic transmission of a voted
11	ballot by, a member of the armed forces of the United States who is
12	on active duty overseas for the general primary election, a runoff
13	primary election, or the general election for state and county
14	officers.
15	(b) The procedures must:
16	(1) require that the early voting clerk of a county
17	send balloting materials to an e-mail address in a form and manner
18	<pre>prescribed by the secretary of state if the voter:</pre>
19	(A) is an FPCA registrant and is eligible for
20	early voting by mail under Sections 101.001(1) and (2)(A);
21	(B) provides a current address that is located
22	outside the United States and is voting from outside the United
23	States;
24	(C) provides an e-mail address that contains the

- 1 voter's name and the suffix ".mil"; and
- 2 (D) requests that balloting materials be sent by
- 3 electronic transmission;
- 4 (2) provide for the verification of the voter;
- 5 (3) provide for the security of the transmission; and
- 6 (4) require the early voting clerk to maintain a
- 7 record of each ballot received under this section.
- 8 <u>(c) An e-mail address provided under this section is</u>
- 9 confidential and does not constitute public information for
- 10 purposes of Chapter 552, Government Code. The early voting clerk
- 11 shall ensure that an e-mail address provided under this section is
- 12 excluded from disclosure.
- 13 <u>(d) If a voter returns both a voted ballot mailed to the</u>
- 14 voter under Section 101.007(a) and a voted ballot transmitted
- 15 electronically under this section, only the ballot that was
- 16 <u>transmitted electronically may be counted.</u>
- 17 (e) The secretary of state may adopt rules as necessary to
- 18 implement this section.
- 19 SECTION 2. Section 105.001, Election Code, is repealed.
- 20 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
