3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
4	SECTION 1. Title 2, Election Code, is amended by adding
5	Chapter 11A to read as follows:
6	CHAPTER 11A. VOTER IDENTIFICATION
7	Sec. 11A.001. APPLICABILITY. (a) Except as provided by
8	Subsection (b), this chapter supersedes a provision of this code or
9	a statute outside this code to the extent of any conflict.
10	(b) This chapter does not apply to the voter registration of
11	a person who is 65 years of age or older. This subsection expires
12	September 1, 2031.
13	Sec. 11A.002. DEFINITION. In this chapter, "department"
1 /	means the Department of Dublic Safety

- 14 means the Department of Public Safety.
- 15 Sec. 11A.003. VOTER IDENTIFICATION ISSUED BY DEPARTMENT.
- 16 (a) The secretary of state shall adopt rules in conjunction with
- 17 the department to establish a process by which the issuance of a
- 18 driver's license or a personal identification card by the
- 19 department is the sole means of voter identification for the
- 20 purposes of being accepted for voting.
- 21 (b) The process established under this section must:
- 22 (1) phase out the use of voter registration
- 23 certificates; and
- 24 (2) provide for the encryption of a person's voter

- 1 registration number on the person's driver's license or personal
- 2 <u>identification card.</u>
- 3 Sec. 11A.004. RULES. (a) The secretary of state shall adopt
- 4 rules as necessary for the implementation and administration of
- 5 this chapter.
- 6 (b) The department shall adopt rules as necessary for the
- 7 <u>implementation and administration of this chapter.</u>
- 8 SECTION 2. Subchapter A, Chapter 12, Election Code, is
- 9 amended by adding Section 12.007 to read as follows:
- 10 Sec. 12.007. CERTAIN ELECTION OFFICERS ARE VOTER
- 11 REGISTRARS. An election officer serving a polling place for early
- 12 voting by personal appearance is a deputy voter registrar and has
- 13 the same authority as a regular deputy registrar.
- 14 SECTION 3. Section 65.054, Election Code, is amended by
- 15 amending Subsection (b) and adding Subsection (b-1) to read as
- 16 follows:
- 17 (b) Except as provided by Subsection (b-1), a [A]
- 18 provisional ballot may be accepted only if the board determines
- 19 that, from the information in the affidavit or contained in public
- $20\,\,$ records, the person is eligible to vote in the election and has not
- 21 previously voted in that election.
- 22 (b-1) A provisional ballot cast under Section 85.0312 shall
- 23 be accepted if the voter registrar determines the applicant is
- 24 eligible for registration under Section 85.0312(d).
- SECTION 4. Subchapter B, Chapter 85, Election Code, is
- 26 amended by adding Section 85.0312 to read as follows:
- Sec. 85.0312. REGISTRATION AT POLLING PLACE DURING EARLY

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- 1 VOTING. (a) A person who would be eligible to vote in an election
- 2 under Section 11.001, but for the requirement to be a registered
- 3 voter, shall be accepted during early voting by personal appearance
- 4 for voting the ballot for the precinct of the person's residence as
- 5 shown by the identification presented if, on the day the person
- 6 offers to vote, the person:
- 7 (1) submits a voter registration application that
- 8 complies with Section 13.002 to an election officer at the polling
- 9 place; and
- 10 (2) presents as proof of residence:
- 11 (A) a Texas driver's license, including a
- 12 temporary license or instruction permit, or personal
- 13 identification card issued to the person by the Department of
- 14 Public Safety that states the person's current address on the day
- 15 the person seeks to vote; or
- 16 (B) a utility bill addressed to the person dated
- 17 not earlier than the 30th day before the date the person seeks to
- 18 <u>vote</u>, and:
- 19 (i) a Texas driver's license, including a
- 20 temporary license or instruction permit, or personal
- 21 identification card issued to the person by the Department of
- 22 Public Safety, regardless of whether the address stated on the
- 23 license or card is current on the day the person seeks to vote;
- 24 <u>(ii) a United States passport issued to the</u>
- 25 person; or
- 26 (iii) a United States military
- 27 identification card that contains the person's photograph.

- 1 (b) The election officer shall make a copy of the proof of
- 2 residence submitted under Subsection (a)(2) and attach it to the
- 3 registration application. The election officer shall return the
- 4 original proof of residence to the voter.
- 5 (c) A person voting under this section shall vote a
- 6 provisional ballot in the manner provided by Section 63.011 except
- 7 that the person is not required to submit the affidavit under
- 8 Section 63.011(a).
- 9 (d) For each registration corresponding to a ballot cast
- 10 under this section, the voter registrar shall review the
- 11 application and copy of the proof of residence and determine
- 12 whether the applicant is eligible for registration as provided by
- 13 Subchapter C, Chapter 13. The registrar shall inform the early
- 14 voting ballot board of a determination made under this subsection.
- 15 A registration approved under this subsection takes effect on the
- 16 date the vote was cast.
- 17 (e) The secretary of state may by rule:
- 18 (1) designate additional documents that a person may
- 19 offer to prove the person's residence to register and vote under
- 20 this section; and
- 21 (2) prescribe procedures to implement this section.
- SECTION 5. Not later than January 1, 2012, the secretary of
- 23 state and the Department of Public Safety shall adopt rules
- 24 required to implement the changes in law made by this Act.
- 25 SECTION 6. This Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
