- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 4 SECTION 1. Section 701.052(a), Insurance Code, is amended
- 5 to read as follows:
- 6 (a) A person is not liable in a civil action, including an
- 7 action for libel or slander, and a civil action may not be brought
- 8 against the person, for furnishing information relating to a
- 9 suspected, anticipated, or completed fraudulent insurance act if
- 10 the information is provided to:
- 11 (1) an authorized governmental agency or the
- 12 department;
- 13 (2) a law enforcement officer or an agent or employee
- 14 of the officer;
- 15 (3) the National Association of Insurance
- 16 Commissioners or an employee of the association;
- 17 (4) a state or federal governmental agency established
- 18 to detect and prevent fraudulent insurance acts or to regulate the
- 19 business of insurance or an employee of the agency; [ex]
- 20 (5) a special investigative unit of an insurer,
- 21 including a person who contracts to provide special investigative
- 22 unit services to the insurer or an employee of the insurer who is
- 23 responsible for the investigation of suspected fraudulent
- 24 insurance acts; or

- 1 (6) an organization described by Section 701.051(c),
- 2 if the person is a member of the organization and:
- 3 (A) the person has reported the information as
- 4 required by Section 701.051(a); or
- 5 (B) the organization has reported the
- 6 information to the insurance fraud unit as required by Section
- 7 701.051(c) on behalf of the person and in a manner that fully
- 8 complies with the person's obligations under Section 701.051(a).
- 9 SECTION 2. The change in law made by this Act applies only
- 10 to the furnishing of information described by Section 701.052(a),
- 11 Insurance Code, as amended by this Act, on or after the effective
- 12 date of this Act. The furnishing of information before the
- 13 effective date of this Act is governed by the law in effect
- 14 immediately before the effective date of this Act, and that law is
- 15 continued in effect for that purpose.
- SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
