## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

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1	AN ACT
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- 2 relating to certain eligibility requirements of the Teach for Texas
- 3 Loan Repayment Assistance Program.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 56.353, Education Code, is amended by
- 6 amending Subsections (a) and (b) and adding Subsection (a-1) to
- 7 read as follows:
- 8 (a) Teach for Texas repayment assistance is available only
- 9 to a person who applies for the assistance and who:
- 10 (1) is certified in a teaching field identified by the
- 11 commissioner of education as experiencing a critical shortage of
- 12 teachers in this state in the year in which the person receives the
- 13 assistance and has for at least one year taught full-time at, and is
- 14 currently teaching full-time at, the preschool, primary, or
- 15 secondary level in a public school in this state in that teaching
- 16 field; [<del>or</del>]
- 17 (2) is a certified educator who has for at least one
- 18 year taught full-time at, and is currently teaching full-time at,
- 19 the preschool, primary, or secondary level in a public school in
- 20 this state at which it is difficult to attract or retain educators,
- 21 as [in a community] identified by the commissioner of education for
- 22 [as experiencing a critical shortage of teachers in] the year in
- 23 which the person receives the assistance; or
- 24 (3) is a certified educator who has for at least one

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- 1 year taught full-time at, and is currently teaching full-time at,
- 2 the preschool, primary, or secondary level in a public school in
- 3 this state in which more than 50 percent of the students enrolled
- 4 are economically disadvantaged, as identified by the commissioner
- 5 of education for the year in which the person receives the
- 6 assistance.
- 7 (a-1) The commissioner of education each year shall
- 8 identify:
- 9 (1) for purposes of Subsections (a)(2) and (3), public
- 10 schools in this state at which it is difficult to attract or retain
- 11 educators; and
- 12 (2) for purposes of Subsection (a)(3), public schools
- 13 in this state in which more than 50 percent of the students enrolled
- 14 are economically disadvantaged.
- 15 (b) The coordinating board in awarding repayment assistance
- 16 shall give priority to applicants who are described by Subsection
- 17 (a)(2) or (3) or who demonstrate financial need.
- 18 SECTION 2. The change in law made by this Act to Section
- 19 56.353, Education Code, applies only to eligibility for loan
- 20 repayment assistance under Subchapter O, Chapter 56, Education
- 21 Code, on the basis of an application submitted on or after September
- 22 1, 2011. Eligibility on the basis of an application submitted
- 23 before September 1, 2011, is covered by the law in effect at the
- 24 time the application was submitted, and the former law is continued
- 25 in effect for that purpose.
- SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
