4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Section 659.140(c), Government Code, is amended
6	to read as follows:
7	(c) <u>The</u> [Each member of the] state policy committee must <u>:</u>
8	(1) be composed of employees and retired state
9	employees receiving benefits under Chapter 814; and
10	(2) [a state employee. The membership must] represent
11	employees at different levels of employee classification.
12	SECTION 2. Section 659.143(b), Government Code, is amended
13	to read as follows:
14	(b) The presiding officer of a local employee committee
15	shall recruit at least five but not more than 10 additional members.
16	The members must represent different levels of employee
17	classification. One or more members may be retired state employees
18	receiving retirement benefits under Chapter 814.
19	SECTION 3. The heading to Section 814.009, Government Code,
20	is amended to read as follows:
21	Sec. 814.009. DEDUCTION FROM ANNUITY FOR STATE EMPLOYEE
22	ORGANIZATION.
23	SECTION 4. Subchapter A, Chapter 814, Government Code, is
24	amended by adding Sections 814.0095 and 814.0096 to read as

1 follows:

Sec. 814.0095. CHARITABLE DEDUCTION FROM ANNUITY. (a) 2 Except as provided by Section 814.0096(c), a person who receives an 3 annuity under this subchapter may, on a printed or electronic form 4 5 filed with the retirement system, authorize the retirement system to deduct from the person's monthly annuity payment the amount of a 6 contribution to the state employee charitable campaign in the 7 8 manner and for the same purposes for which a state employee may authorize deductions to that campaign under Subchapter I, Chapter 9 659<u>.</u> 10 (b) An authorization under this section must direct the 11 12 board of trustees to deposit the deducted funds with the comptroller for distribution as required by Section 659.132(g) in 13 the same manner in which a state employee's deduction is 14 distributed. 15 (c) An authorization under this section remains in effect 16 for the period described by Section 659.137 unless the person 17 revokes the authorization by giving notice to the board of 18 19 trustees. (d) The board of trustees may adopt rules to administer this 20

21 <u>section. Any rules adopted must be consistent with the</u> 22 <u>comptroller's rules related to the state employee charitable</u> 23 <u>campaign.</u>

24 <u>Sec. 814.0096. COORDINATION WITH STATE EMPLOYEE CHARITABLE</u> 25 <u>CAMPAIGN POLICY COMMITTEE. (a) The board of trustees and the state</u> 26 <u>employee charitable campaign policy committee established under</u> 27 <u>Section 659.140 shall coordinate responsibility for the</u>

1	administration of charitable deductions from annuity payments to
2	the state employee charitable campaign under Section 814.0095.
3	(b) The state policy committee is authorized to approve a
4	budget that includes funding for as many of the expenses incurred by
5	the retirement system associated with the implementation and
6	administration of annuitants' participation in the state employee
7	charitable campaign as is practicable, including notification of
8	annuitants.
9	(c) Except as provided by this subsection, the board of
10	trustees shall charge an administrative fee to cover any costs not
11	paid under Subsection (b) in the implementation of Section 814.0095
12	to the charitable organizations participating in the state employee
13	charitable campaign conducted under that section in the same
14	proportion that the contributions to that charitable organization
15	bear to the total of contributions in that campaign. The board of
16	trustees shall determine the most efficient and effective method of
17	collecting the administrative fee and shall adopt rules for the
18	implementation of this subsection.
19	(d) If necessary, the board of trustees and the state policy

20 <u>committee may make the annuity deduction authorization under</u> 21 <u>Section 814.0095(a) available in stages to subgroups of the</u> 22 <u>retirement system's annuity recipients as money becomes available</u> 23 <u>to cover the expenses under Subsection (b) of this section.</u>

SECTION 5. (a) The board of trustees of the Employees Retirement System of Texas, in cooperation with the comptroller and the state employee charitable campaign policy committee established under Section 659.140, Government Code, as amended by

H.B. No. 1608 1 this Act, may adopt rules to implement Sections 814.0095 and 2 814.0096, Government Code, as added by this Act.

3 (b) The board of trustees of the Employees Retirement System 4 of Texas by rule shall designate the start date on which annuity 5 deductions begin under Sections 814.0095 and 814.0096, Government 6 Code, as added by this Act.

7 SECTION 6. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 8 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 9 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 10 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 11 Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
