(a) The process server review board established by supreme court order may recommend to the supreme court the fees to be charged for process server certification and renewal of certification. On renewal 1-24 of the certification on the new expiration date, the process server 1**-**25 1**-**26 must pay the entire certification renewal fee. Fees collected 1-29 under this section shall be sent to the comptroller for deposit to the credit of the general revenue fund and may be appropriated only to the office for purposes of this section.
