A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

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- 2 relating to the creation of a commission to study capital
- 3 punishment in Texas and to a moratorium on executions.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Chapter 37, Code of Criminal Procedure, is
- 6 amended by adding Article 37.15 to read as follows:
- 7 Art. 37.15. TEXAS CAPITAL PUNISHMENT COMMISSION
- 8 Sec. 1. CREATION. The Texas Capital Punishment Commission
- 9 is created.
- 10 Sec. 2. DUTIES. (a) The commission shall study capital
- 11 <u>punishment in this state</u>, <u>concentrating</u> particularly on issues
- 12 relating to the legal representation of inmates in capital cases,
- 13 the certainty of the guilt of individuals convicted in capital
- 14 cases, and the sufficiency of appellate review of convictions in
- 15 capital cases.
- 16 (b) The commission shall consult and cooperate with the
- 17 Texas Criminal Justice Integrity Unit, as appointed by the Texas
- 18 Court of Criminal Appeals, when conducting the study described by
- 19 Subsection (a).
- 20 <u>(c) After completing the study, the commission shall</u>
- 21 propose legislation to correct any inequities in the capital
- 22 punishment process in this state.
- Sec. 3. COMPOSITION. (a) The commission is composed of
- 24 nine members appointed by the governor, three of whom must be

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- 1 appointed from a list of candidates submitted to the governor by the
- 2 speaker of the house of representatives and three of whom must be
- 3 appointed from a list of candidates submitted to the governor by the
- 4 lieutenant governor. The governor may reject the candidates on a
- 5 list and require a new list to be submitted.
- 6 (b) Each member serves at the pleasure of the governor.
- 7 <u>(c) The governor shall designate a member to serve as</u>
- 8 presiding officer.
- 9 (d) Each member of the commission must be generally
- 10 <u>experienced in criminal justice matters.</u> In addition, there must
- 11 be at least one member of the commission who is experienced in the
- 12 prosecution of capital cases, one who is experienced in the defense
- 13 of capital cases, and one who is experienced as a trial judge in
- 14 capital cases. The governor shall ensure that the commission
- 15 members have the qualifications required by this subsection.
- Sec. 4. REIMBURSEMENT. A member of the commission is not
- 17 entitled to compensation but is entitled to reimbursement for the
- 18 member's travel expenses as provided by Chapter 660, Government
- 19 Code, and the General Appropriations Act.
- 20 <u>Sec. 5. ASSISTANCE. The Texas Legislative Council</u> and the
- 21 Legislative Budget Board shall assist the commission in performing
- 22 the commission's duties.
- Sec. 6. SUBMISSION. The commission shall submit the
- 24 proposed legislation described by Section 2 to the lieutenant
- 25 governor and the speaker of the house of representatives not later
- 26 than December 1, 2012.
- Sec. 7. INITIAL APPOINTMENTS. The governor shall make the

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- 1 appointments to the commission as soon as possible after the
- 2 effective date of this article.
- 3 Sec. 8. MORATORIUM. The state may not execute an inmate on
- 4 or after the effective date of this article and before September 1,
- 5 2013.
- 6 Sec. 9. OTHER LAW. The commission is not subject to Chapter
- 7 2110, Government Code.
- 8 Sec. 10. ABOLITION. The commission is abolished on January
- 9 1, 2013, and this article expires on that date.
- 10 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
