## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to the amount of certain civil penalties and criminal
- 3 fines assessed under the Health and Safety Code.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 401.383(b), Health and Safety Code, is
- 6 amended to read as follows:
- 7 (b) An offense under this section is a Class A misdemeanor,
- 8 unless it is shown at the trial of the person that the person has
- 9 been previously convicted of an offense under this section, in
- 10 which event the offense is punishable by a fine of not less than
- 11  $\$4,000 \ [\$2,000]$  or more than \$100,000, confinement in the county
- 12 jail for not more than one year, or both.
- SECTION 2. Section 502.015(b), Health and Safety Code, is
- 14 amended to read as follows:
- 15 (b) The penalty may be in an amount not to exceed \$4,000
- 16 [\$2,000] a day for each violation, with a total not to exceed
- 17 \$20,000 for that violation.
- SECTION 3. Section 822.114(a), Health and Safety Code, is
- 19 amended to read as follows:
- 20 (a) A person who violates Section 822.103(a) is liable for a
- 21 civil penalty of not less than \$200 and not more than \$4,000
- [\$2,000] for each animal with respect to which there is a violation
- 23 and for each day the violation continues.
- 24 SECTION 4. (a) The change in law made by this Act to Section

- 1 401.383(b), Health and Safety Code, applies only to an offense
- 2 committed on or after the effective date of this Act. An offense
- 3 committed before the effective date of this Act is governed by the
- 4 law in effect on the date the offense was committed, and the former
- 5 law is continued in effect for that purpose. For purposes of this
- 6 section, an offense was committed before the effective date of this
- 7 Act if any element of the offense occurred before that date.
- 8 (b) The changes in law made by this Act to Sections
- 9 502.015(b) and 822.114(a), Health and Safety Code, apply only to
- 10 conduct occurring on or after the effective date of this Act.
- 11 Conduct occurring before the effective date of this Act is governed
- 12 by the law in effect on the date the conduct occurred, and the
- 13 former law is continued in effect for that purpose.
- 14 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
