5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. Subtitle C, Title 4, Special District Local Laws
7	Code, is amended by adding Chapter 3867 to read as follows:
8	CHAPTER 3867. RIO DE VIDA PLANNING AND IMPROVEMENT
9	DISTRICT NO. 1
10	SUBCHAPTER A. GENERAL PROVISIONS
11	Sec. 3867.001. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter:
12	(1) "Board" means the district's board of directors.
13	(2) "City" means the City of Austin, Texas.
14	(3) "County" means Travis County.
15	(4) "Director" means a board member.
16	(5) "District" means the Rio de Vida Planning and
17	<pre>Improvement District No. 1.</pre>
18	(6) "Improvement project" means a project authorized
19	by Section 3867.102 or Subchapter C-1.
20	Sec. 3867.002. CREATION AND NATURE OF DISTRICT. The
21	district is a special district created under Section 59, Article
22	XVI, Texas Constitution.
23	Sec. 3867.003. PURPOSE; DECLARATION OF INTENT. (a) The
24	creation of the district is essential to accomplish the purposes of

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- 1 Sections 52 and 52-a, Article III, and Section 59, Article XVI,
- 2 Texas Constitution, and other public purposes stated in this
- 3 chapter. By creating the district and in authorizing the city, the
- 4 county, and other political subdivisions to contract with the
- 5 district, the legislature has established a program to accomplish
- 6 the public purposes set out in Section 52-a, Article III, Texas
- 7 Constitution.
- 8 (b) The creation of the district is necessary to promote,
- 9 develop, encourage, <u>and maintain employment, commerce,</u>
- 10 transportation, housing, tourism, recreation, the arts,
- 11 entertainment, economic development, safety, and the public
- 12 welfare in the district.
- 13 (c) This chapter and the creation of the district may not be
- 14 interpreted to relieve the city or the county from providing the
- 15 <u>level of services provided as of the effective date of the Act</u>
- 16 enacting this chapter to the area in the district. The district is
- 17 created to supplement and not to supplant city and county services
- 18 provided in the district.
- 19 Sec. 3867.004. FINDINGS OF BENEFIT AND PUBLIC PURPOSE. (a)
- 20 The district is created to serve a public use and benefit.
- 21 (b) All land and other property included in the district
- 22 will benefit from the improvements and services to be provided by
- 23 the district under powers conferred by Sections 52 and 52-a,
- 24 Article III, and Section 59, Article XVI, Texas Constitution, and
- 25 other powers granted under this chapter.
- 26 (c) The creation of the district is in the public interest
- 27 and is essential to further the public purposes of:

- 1 (1) developing and diversifying the economy of the 2 state;
- 3 (2) eliminating unemployment and underemployment; and
- 4 (3) developing or expanding transportation and
- 5 commerce.
- 6 (d) The district will:
- 7 (1) promote the health, safety, and general welfare of
- 8 residents, employers, potential employees, employees, visitors,
- 9 and consumers in the district, and of the public;
- 10 (2) provide needed funding for the district to
- 11 preserve, maintain, and enhance the economic health and vitality of
- 12 the district territory as a community and business center; and
- 13 (3) promote the health, safety, welfare, and enjoyment
- 14 of the public by providing pedestrian ways and public gardens and by
- 15 landscaping and developing certain areas in the district, which are
- 16 necessary for the restoration, preservation, and enhancement of
- 17 scenic beauty.
- 18 (e) Pedestrian ways along or across a street, whether at
- 19 grade or above or below the surface, and street lighting, street
- 20 landscaping, parking, and street art objects are parts of and
- 21 necessary components of a street and are considered to be a street
- 22 or road improvement.
- 23 <u>(f) The district will not act as the agent or</u>
- 24 instrumentality of any private interest even though the district
- 25 will benefit many private interests as well as the public.
- Sec. 3867.005. DISTRICT TERRITORY. (a) The district is
- 27 composed of the territory described by Section 2 of the Act enacting

- 1 this chapter, as that territory may have been modified under
- 2 Section 3867.110 or other law.
- 3 (b) The boundaries and field notes of the district contained
- 4 in Section 2 of the Act enacting this chapter form a closure. A
- 5 mistake in the field notes of the district contained in Section 2 of
- 6 the Act enacting this chapter or in copying the field notes in the
- 7 legislative process does not affect the district's:
- 8 (1) organization, existence, or validity;
- 9 (2) right to issue any type of bond or other obligation
- 10 for a purpose for which the district is created or to pay the
- 11 principal of and interest on the bond;
- 12 (3) right to impose or collect an assessment or tax; or
- 13 (4) legality or operation.
- 14 Sec. 3867.006. ELIGIBILITY FOR INCLUSION IN SPECIAL ZONES.
- 15 All or any part of the area of the district is eligible to be
- 16 included in:
- 17 (1) a tax abatement reinvestment zone created under
- 18 Chapter 312, Tax Code;
- 19 (2) an enterprise zone created under Chapter 2303,
- 20 Government Code; or
- 21 (3) an industrial district created under Chapter 42,
- 22 Local Government Code.
- Sec. 3867.007. MUNICIPAL CONSENT REQUIRED. (a) The
- 24 district may not hold an election under Subchapter E until each
- 25 <u>municipality in whose corporate limits or extraterritorial</u>
- 26 jurisdiction the district is located consents by ordinance or
- 27 resolution to:

- 1 (1) the district's creation; and 2 (2) the inclusion of the municipality's land in the 3 district. 4 (b) Consent issued by the city under Subsection (a) may 5 include terms relating to: 6 (1) annexation by the city under Subchapter J; and 7 (2) the continuation of all or a portion of the 8 district's operations after annexation by the city under Subchapter 9 J. 10 Sec. 3867.008. APPLICABILITY OF MUNICIPAL MANAGEMENT DISTRICTS LAW. Except as otherwise provided by this chapter, 11 12 Chapter 375, Local Government Code, applies to the district. Sec. 3867.009. LIBERAL CONSTRUCTION OF CHAPTER. 13 chapter shall be liberally construed in conformity with the 14 15 findings and purposes stated in this chapter. [Sections 3867.010-3867.050 reserved for expansion] 16 17 SUBCHAPTER B. BOARD OF DIRECTORS Sec. 3867.051. GOVERNING BODY; TERMS. The district is 18 19 governed by a board of five voting directors who serve staggered terms of four years, with two or three directors' terms expiring 20 June 1 of each odd-numbered year. 21 Sec. 3867.052. APPOINTMENT OF DIRECTORS. (a) Except as 22 provided by Subsection (c), the members of the governing body of the 23 24 city shall appoint four directors from persons recommended by the board and one director who has at least 15 years of experience in 25
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(b) A person is appointed if a majority of the members of the

the commercial real estate industry.

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2	(c) Beginning on January 1, 2041, the members of the
3	governing body of the city may appoint directors without the
4	recommendation of the board. This subsection applies only to a
5	director whose term expires on or after January 1, 2041.
6	Sec. 3867.053. QUALIFICATIONS. To be qualified to serve as
7	a director, a person must:
8	(1) reside in the district; or
9	(2) own real property in the district.
10	Sec. 3867.054. QUORUM. For purposes of determining the
11	requirements for a quorum of the board, the following are not
12	<pre>counted:</pre>
13	(1) a board position vacant for any reason, including
14	death, resignation, or disqualification; or
15	(2) a director who is abstaining from participation in
16	a vote because of a conflict of interest.
17	Sec. 3867.055. COMPENSATION. A director is entitled to
18	receive fees of office and reimbursement for actual expenses as
19	provided by Section 49.060, Water Code. Sections 375.069 and
20	375.070, Local Government Code, do not apply to the board.
21	Sec. 3867.056. INITIAL DIRECTORS. (a) The initial board

9	SUBCHAPTER C. POWERS AND DUTIES
10	Sec. 3867.101. GENERAL POWERS AND DUTIES. The district has
11	the powers and duties necessary to accomplish the purposes for
12	which the district is created.
13	Sec. 3867.102. IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS AND SERVICES. The
14	district may provide, design, construct, acquire, improve,
15	relocate, operate, maintain, or finance an improvement project or
16	service using money available to the district, or contract with a
17	governmental or private entity to provide, design, construct,
18	acquire, improve, relocate, operate, maintain, or finance ar
19	improvement project or service authorized under this chapter,
20	including a project or service described by Subchapter C-1, or
21	under Chapter 375, Local Government Code.
22	Sec. 3867.103. NONPROFIT CORPORATION. (a) The board by
23	resolution may authorize the creation of a nonprofit corporation to
24	assist and act for the district in implementing a project or
25	providing a service authorized by this chapter.
26	(b) The nonprofit corporation:
27	(1) has each power of and is considered to be a local

- 1 government corporation created under Subchapter D, Chapter 431,
- 2 Transportation Code; and
- 3 (2) may implement any project and provide any service
- 4 authorized by this chapter.
- 5 (c) The board shall appoint the board of directors of the
- 6 nonprofit corporation. The board of directors of the nonprofit
- 7 corporation shall serve in the same manner as the board of directors
- 8 of a local government corporation created under Subchapter D,
- 9 Chapter 431, Transportation Code, except that a board member is not
- 10 required to reside in the district.
- 11 Sec. 3867.104. AGREEMENTS; GRANTS. (a) As provided by
- 12 Chapter 375, Local Government Code, the district may make an
- 13 agreement with or accept a gift, grant, or loan from any person.
- 14 (b) The implementation of a project is a governmental
- 15 <u>function</u> or service for the purposes of Chapter 791, Government
- 16 <u>Code</u>.
- Sec. 3867.105. LAW ENFORCEMENT SERVICES. To protect the
- 18 public interest, the district may contract with a qualified party,
- 19 including the county or the city, to provide law enforcement
- 20 services in the district for a fee.
- 21 Sec. 3867.106. MEMBERSHIP IN CHARITABLE ORGANIZATIONS. The
- 22 district may join and pay dues to a charitable or nonprofit
- 23 organization that performs a service or provides an activity
- 24 consistent with the furtherance of a district purpose.
- Sec. 3867.107. ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT. (a) The district may
- 26 engage in activities that accomplish the economic development
- 27 purposes of the district.

- 1 (b) The district may establish and provide for the
- 2 administration of one or more programs to promote state or local
- 3 economic development and to stimulate business and commercial
- 4 activity in the district, including programs to:
- 5 (1) make loans and grants of public money; and
- 6 (2) provide district personnel and services.
- 7 (c) The district may create economic development programs
- 8 and exercise the economic development powers that:
- 9 (1) Chapter 380, Local Government Code, provides to a
- 10 <u>muni</u>cipality; and
- 11 (2) Subchapter A, Chapter 1509, Government Code,
- 12 provides to a municipality.
- Sec. 3867.108. PARKING FACILITIES. (a) The district may
- 14 acquire, lease as lessor or lessee, construct, develop, own,
- 15 operate, and maintain parking facilities or a system of parking
- 16 facilities, including lots, garages, parking terminals, or other
- 17 structures or accommodations for parking motor vehicles off the
- 18 streets and related appurtenances.
- 19 (b) The district's parking facilities serve the public
- 20 purposes of the district and are owned, used, and held for a public
- 21 purpose even if leased or operated by a private entity for a term of
- 22 years.
- 23 <u>(c) The district's parking facilities are parts of and</u>
- 24 necessary components of a street and are considered to be a street
- 25 or road improvement.
- 26 (d) The development and operation of the district's parking
- 27 facilities may be considered an economic development program.

- 1 Sec. 3867.109. STRATEGIC PARTNERSHIP AGREEMENT. The
- 2 district may negotiate and enter into a written strategic
- 3 partnership agreement with a municipality under Section 43.0751,
- 4 Local Government Code.
- 5 Sec. 3867.110. ANNEXATION OR EXCLUSION OF LAND. (a) The
- 6 district may annex land as provided by Subchapter J, Chapter 49,
- 7 Water Code.
- 8 (b) The district may exclude land as provided by Subchapter
- 9 J, Chapter 49, Water Code. Section 375.044(b), Local Government
- 10 Code, does not apply to the district.
- 11 Sec. 3867.111. NO EMINENT DOMAIN POWER. The district may
- 12 not exercise the power of eminent domain.
- 13 [Sections 3867.112-3867.150 reserved for expansion]
- 14 SUBCHAPTER C-1. IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS
- 15 Sec. 3867.151. IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS. In addition to the
- 16 general authority provided by Section 3867.102, the district may
- 17 provide, or it may contract with a governmental or private entity to
- 18 provide, an improvement project described by this subchapter or
- 19 activities in support of or incidental to those projects.
- Sec. 3867.152. WATER OR SEWER FACILITY. An improvement
- 21 project may include the planning, design, construction,
- 22 improvement, maintenance, and operation of a water or sewer
- 23 facility.
- Sec. 3867.153. POTABLE WATER. An improvement project may
- 25 include a supply and distribution facility or system to provide
- 26 potable water to district residents and businesses.
- Sec. 3867.154. NONPOTABLE WATER. An improvement project

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- 1 may include a facility or system designed to enable approved use of
- 2 nonpotable water, including wastewater supply, collection,
- 3 treatment, transmission, and distribution to district residents
- 4 and businesses.
- 5 Sec. 3867.155. WASTEWATER. An improvement project may
- 6 include a facility or system to provide wastewater collection,
- 7 treatment, and disposal to serve district residents and businesses.
- 8 <u>Sec. 3867.156.</u> DRAINAGE. An improvement project may
- 9 include the planning, design, construction, improvement, and
- 10 maintenance of a drainage facility for the district.
- 11 Sec. 3867.157. STORM WATER. An improvement project may
- 12 include protection and improvement of the quality of storm water
- 13 that flows through the district and may include the planning,
- 14 design, construction, improvement, and maintenance of a storm water
- 15 detention improvement.
- Sec. 3867.158. WETLANDS. An improvement project may
- 17 include the planning, design, construction, improvement,
- 18 maintenance, and operation of a facility for wetlands enhancement.
- 19 Sec. 3867.159. RECREATION. An improvement project may
- 20 include a recreational facility, including public boat ramps and
- 21 docks on the district's Colorado River frontage.
- Sec. 3867.160. POWER GENERATION. An improvement project
- 23 may include the planning, design, construction, improvement,
- 24 maintenance, and operation of an alternative power generation
- 25 facility located in or outside of the district, including:
- 26 (1) a facility for solar, geothermal, or wind power;
- 27 and

1 (2) appurtenant transmission facilities. 2 Sec. 3867.161. ROADS. An improvement project may include a paved road or street inside and outside the district, to the extent 3 authorized by Section 52, Article III, Texas Constitution. 4 Sec. 3867.162. PARKING OR HELIPORT. An improvement project 5 may include the planning, design, construction, improvement, 6 7 maintenance, and operation of an off-street parking facility or 8 heliport. Sec. 3867.163. EDUCATION AND CULTURE. An improvement 9 10 project may include the planning and acquisition of: 11 (1) public art and sculpture and related exhibits and 12 facilities; or 13 (2) an educational facility and a cultural exhibit or 14 facility. 15 Sec. 3867.164. CONVENTION CENTER. An improvement project may include the planning, design, construction, acquisition, 16 lease, rental, improvement, maintenance, installation, and 17 management of and provision of furnishings for a facility for: 18 (1) a conference, convention, or exhibition; 19 (2) a manufacturer, consumer, or trade show; 20 21 (3) a civic, community, or institutional event; or (4) an exhibit, display, attraction, special event, or 22

18	SUBCHAPTER D. GENERAL FINANCIAL PROVISIONS; ASSESSMENTS
19	Sec. 3867.201. TAX AND ASSESSMENT ABATEMENTS. The district
20	may designate reinvestment zones and may grant abatements of a tax
21	or assessment on property in the zones.
22	Sec. 3867.202. DISBURSEMENTS AND TRANSFERS OF MONEY. The
23	board by resolution shall establish the number of directors'
24	signatures and the procedure required for a disbursement or
25	transfer of district money.
26	Sec. 3867.203. MONEY USED FOR IMPROVEMENTS OR SERVICES.
27	The district may acquire construct finance operate maintain or

- 1 provide any improvement or service authorized under this chapter or
- 2 Chapter 375, Local Government Code, using any money available to
- 3 the district.
- 4 Sec. 3867.204. PETITION REQUIRED FOR FINANCING SERVICES AND

- 14 district subject to assessment, if more than 25 persons own real

- 17 Sec. 3867.205. METHOD OF NOTICE FOR HEARING. The district
- 18 may mail the notice required by Section 375.115(c), Local
- 19 Government Code, by certified or first class United States mail.
- 20 The board shall determine the method of notice.
- 21 <u>Sec. 3867.206.</u> ASSESSMENTS; LIENS FOR ASSESSMENTS. (a)
- 22 The board by resolution may impose and collect an assessment for any
- 23 purpose authorized by this chapter in all or any part of the
- 24 district.
- (b) An assessment, a reassessment, or an assessment
- 26 resulting from an addition to or correction of the assessment roll
- 27 by the district, penalties and interest on an assessment or

- 1 reassessment, an expense of collection, and reasonable attorney's
- 2 fees incurred by the district are:
- 3 (1) a first and prior lien against the property
- 4 assessed;
- 5 (2) superior to any other lien or claim other than a
- 6 lien or claim for county, school district, or municipal ad valorem
- 7 taxes; and
- 8 (3) the personal liability of and a charge against the
- 9 owners of the property even if the owners are not named in the
- 10 <u>assessment proceedings.</u>
- 11 <u>(c)</u> The lien is effective from the date of the board's
- 12 resolution imposing the assessment until the date the assessment is
- 13 paid. The board may enforce the lien in the same manner that the
- 14 board may enforce an ad valorem tax lien against real property.
- 15 (d) The board may make a correction to or deletion from the
- 16 assessment roll that does not increase the amount of assessment of
- 17 any parcel of land without providing notice and holding a hearing in
- 18 the manner required for additional assessments.
- 19 Sec. 3867.207. RESIDENTIAL PROPERTY NOT EXEMPT. Section
- 20 <u>375.161</u>, Local Government Code, does not apply to:
- 21 (1) a tax authorized or approved by district voters;
- 22 or
- (2) a required payment for a service provided by the
- 24 district, including water and sewer service.
- Sec. 3867.208. COMPETITIVE BIDDING. Subchapter I, Chapter
- 26 49, Water Code, applies to the district. Sections 375.221 and
- 27 375.223, Local Government Code, do not apply to the district.

2	SUBCHAPTER E. TAXES AND BONDS
3	Sec. 3867.251. ELECTIONS REGARDING CERTAIN TAXES AND BONDS.
4	(a) The district may issue, without an election, bonds, notes, and
5	other obligations secured by:
6	(1) revenue other than ad valorem taxes; or
7	(2) contract payments described by Section 3867.253.
8	(b) The district must hold an election in the manner
9	provided by Subchapter L, Chapter 375, Local Government Code, to
10	obtain voter approval before the district may impose an ad valorem
11	tax or sales and use tax or issue bonds payable from ad valorem
12	taxes.
13	(c) Section 375.243, Local Government Code, does not apply
14	to the district.
15	(d) All or any part of any facilities or improvements that
16	may be acquired by a district by the issuance of district bonds may
17	be included in one single proposition to be voted on at the election
18	or the bonds may be submitted in several propositions.
19	Sec. 3867.252. OPERATION AND MAINTENANCE TAX. (a) If
20	authorized by a majority of the district voters voting at an
21	election held under Section 3867.251, the district may impose an
22	operation and maintenance tax on taxable property in the district
23	in accordance with Section 49.107, Water Code, for any district
24	<pre>purpose, including to:</pre>
25	(1) operate and maintain the district;
26	(2) construct or acquire improvements; or
27	(3) provide a service.

- 1 (b) The board shall determine the tax rate. The rate may not
- 2 exceed the rate approved at the election.
- 3 (c) The board may impose the tax authorized by this section
- 4 after full-purpose annexation by the city under Subchapter J. The
- 5 board may use the tax revenue to pay for maintaining parks, wet
- 6 ponds, and other open space amenities in the district. To the
- 7 extent of a conflict between this subsection and any other law, this
- 8 subsection controls.
- 9 Sec. 3867.253. CONTRACT TAXES. (a) In accordance with
- 10 Section 49.108, Water Code, the district may impose a tax other than
- 11 an operation and maintenance tax and use the revenue derived from
- 12 the tax to make payments under a contract after the provisions of
- 13 the contract have been approved by a majority of the district voters
- 14 voting at an election held for that purpose.
- 15 (b) A contract approved by the district voters may contain a
- 16 provision stating that the contract may be modified or amended by
- 17 the board without further voter approval.
- 18 Sec. 3867.254. AUTHORITY TO BORROW MONEY AND TO ISSUE BONDS
- 19 AND OTHER OBLIGATIONS. (a) The district may borrow money on terms
- 20 determined by the board. Section 375.205, Local Government Code,
- 21 does not apply to a loan, line of credit, or other borrowing from a

- 18 Highway No. 130, $S27^{\circ}27'34''W$ a distance of 5,047.34 feet to a
- 19 calculated angle point;
- THENCE, continuing with the west right-of-way line of said
- 21 State Highway No. 130, S27 $^{\circ}$ 52'12"W a distance of 588.10 feet to a
- 22 calculated point at the southeast corner of said Parcel 07-1;
- 23 THENCE, with the south line of said Parcel 07-1, N63°23'09"W a
- 24 distance of 1,723.19 feet to a 1/2" iron rod found with cap marked
- 25 "Brooks-Baker" on the east right-of-way line of said FM Highway No.
- 26 973 at the southwest corner of said Parcel 07-1;
- THENCE, with the east right-of-way line of said FM Highway

- 1 No. 973, the following three (3) courses:
- 1) N27°00'51"E a distance of 790.98 feet to a calculated
- 3 angle point;
- 4 2) $N27^{\circ}35'51''E$ a distance of 4,186.86 feet to a calculated
- 5 angle point; and
- 6 3) $N27^{\circ}44'31''E$ a distance of 657.55 feet to the POINT OF
- 7 BEGINNING, and containing 223 acres of land, more or less.
- 8 The gross area contained within Tracts 1, 2, 3, 4 and 5 totals
- 9 2,132 acres of land, more or less.
- 10 SECTION 3. (a) The legal notice of the intention to
- 11 introduce this Act, setting forth the general substance of this
- 12 Act, has been published as provided by law, and the notice and a
- 13 copy of this Act have been furnished to all persons, agencies,
- 14 officials, or entities to which they are required to be furnished
- 15 under Section 59, Article XVI, Texas Constitution, and Chapter 313,
- 16 Government Code.
- 17 (b) The governor, one of the required recipients, has
- 18 submitted the notice and Act to the Texas Commission on
- 19 Environmental Quality.
- 20 (c) The Texas Commission on Environmental Quality has filed
- 21 its recommendations relating to this Act with the governor,
- 22 lieutenant governor, and speaker of the house of representatives
- 23 within the required time.
- 24 (d) The general law relating to consent by political
- 25 subdivisions to the creation of districts with conservation,
- 26 reclamation, and road powers and the inclusion of land in those
- 27 districts has been complied with.

- 1 (e) All requirements of the constitution and laws of this
- 2 state and the rules and procedures of the legislature with respect
- 3 to the notice, introduction, and passage of this Act have been
- 4 fulfilled and accomplished.
- 5 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 6 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 7 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 8 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 9 Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
