- 5 SECTION 1. The heading to Section 406.096, Labor Code, is
- 6 amended to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 406.096. REQUIRED COVERAGE FOR [CERTAIN] BUILDING OR
- 8 CONSTRUCTION CONTRACTORS.
- 9 SECTION 2. Section 406.096, Labor Code, is amended by
- 10 amending Subsections (a), (b), and (c) and adding Subsection (a-1)
- 11 to read as follows:
- 12 (a) A contractor shall provide workers' compensation
- 13 insurance coverage for each employee of the contractor. A
- 14 subcontractor shall provide workers' compensation insurance
- 15 coverage for each employee of the subcontractor.
- 16 (a-1) A governmental entity that enters into a building or
- 17 construction contract shall require the contractor to certify in
- 18 writing that the contractor provides workers' compensation
- 19 insurance coverage for each employee of the contractor employed on
- 20 the public project.
- (b) Each subcontractor on \underline{a} [the] public project shall
- 22 provide [such] a certificate relating to coverage of the
- 23 subcontractor's employees to the general contractor, who shall
- 24 provide the subcontractor's certificate to the governmental

- 2 (c) A contractor <u>may provide</u> [who has a contract that
- 3 requires] workers' compensation insurance coverage [may provide
- 4 the coverage] through a group plan or other method. If the
- 5 contractor enters into a contract with a governmental entity for a
- 6 public project, the coverage must be satisfactory to the governing
- 7 body of the governmental entity.
- 8 SECTION 3. The change in law made by this Act applies only
- 9 to a contract for building or construction that is entered into on
- 10 or after the effective date of this Act. A contract entered into
- 11 before the effective date of this Act is governed by the law in
- 12 effect on the date the contract was entered into, and the former law
- 13 is continued in effect for that purpose.
- 14 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
