- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 4 SECTION 1. Section 133.004, Local Government Code, as
- 5 amended by Chapters 718 (H.B. 2359), 1027 (H.B. 1623), and 1149
- 6 (S.B. 1119), Acts of the 80th Legislature, Regular Session, 2007,
- 7 is reenacted and amended to read as follows:
- 8 Sec. 133.004. CIVIL FEES. This chapter applies to the
- 9 following civil fees:
- 10 (1) the consolidated fee on filing in district court
- 11 imposed under Section 133.151;
- 12 (2) the filing fee in district court for basic civil
- 13 legal services for indigents imposed under Section 133.152;
- 14 (3) the filing fee in courts other than district court
- 15 for basic civil legal services for indigents imposed under Section
- 16 133.153;
- 17 (4) the filing fees for the judicial fund imposed in
- 18 certain statutory county courts under Section 51.702, Government
- 19 Code;
- 20 (5) the filing fees for the judicial fund imposed in
- 21 certain county courts under Section 51.703, Government Code;
- 22 (6) the filing fees for the judicial fund imposed in
- 23 statutory probate courts under Section 51.704, Government Code;
- 24 (7) fees collected under Section 118.015;

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- 1 (8) marriage license fees for the family trust fund
- 2 collected under Section 118.018;
- 3 (9) marriage license or declaration of informal
- 4 marriage fees for the child abuse and neglect prevention trust fund
- 5 account collected under Section 118.022;
- 6 (10) the filing fee for the judicial fund imposed in
- 7 district court, statutory county court, and county court under
- 8 Section 133.154; [and]
- 9 (11) the portion of the civil or administrative
- 10 penalty described by Section 542.406(c) [542.406(c)(1)],
- 11 Transportation Code, imposed by a local authority to enforce
- 12 compliance with the instructions of a traffic-control signal; and
- 13 (12) $[\frac{(11)}{}]$ the portion of the civil or administrative
- 14 penalty described by Section 707.008(a) [707.008(a)(1)],
- 15 Transportation Code, imposed by a local authority to enforce
- 16 compliance with the instructions of a traffic-control signal.
- SECTION 2. Sections 542.406(c) and (e), Transportation
- 18 Code, are amended to read as follows:
- 19 (c) Not later than the 60th day after the end of a local
- 20 authority's fiscal year, after deducting amounts the local
- 21 authority is authorized by Subsection (d) to retain, the local
- 22 authority shall[+
- [$\frac{(1)}{(1)}$] send $\frac{100}{(1)}$ [$\frac{50}{(1)}$] percent of the revenue derived from
- 24 civil or administrative penalties collected by the local authority
- 25 under this section to the comptroller for deposit to the credit of
- 26 the regional trauma account established under Section 782.002,
- 27 Health and Safety Code[; and

- 1 [(2) deposit the remainder of the revenue in a special
- 2 account in the local authority's treasury that may be used only to
- 3 fund traffic safety programs, including pedestrian safety
- 4 programs, public safety programs, intersection improvements, and
- 5 traffic enforcement].
- 6 (e) Chapter 133, Local Government Code, applies to fee
- 7 revenue described by Subsection (c) [(c)(1)].
- 8 SECTION 3. Sections 707.008(a) and (c), Transportation
- 9 Code, are amended to read as follows:
- 10 (a) Not later than the 60th day after the end of a local
- 11 authority's fiscal year, after deducting amounts the local
- 12 authority is authorized by Subsection (b) to retain, the local
- 13 authority shall[+
- [(1)] send 100 [50] percent of the revenue derived from
- 15 civil or administrative penalties collected by the local authority
- 16 under this section to the comptroller for deposit to the credit of
- 17 the regional trauma account established under Section 782.002,
- 18 Health and Safety Code[+ and
- 19 [(2) deposit the remainder of the revenue in a special
- 20 account in the local authority's treasury that may be used only to
- 21 fund traffic safety programs, including pedestrian safety
- 22 programs, public safety programs, intersection improvements, and
- 23 traffic enforcement].
- (c) Chapter 133, Local Government Code, applies to fee
- 25 revenue described by Subsection (a) $[\frac{(a)(1)}{(a)}]$.
- SECTION 4. The changes in law made by this Act to Sections
- 27 542.406 and 707.008, Transportation Code, apply only to a penalty

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- 1 collected on or after the effective date of this Act. A penalty
- 2 collected before the effective date of this Act is governed by the
- 3 law in effect on the date the penalty was collected, and the former
- 4 law is continued in effect for that purpose.
- 5 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
