4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subchapter D, Chapter 2251, Insurance Code, is
6	amended by adding Section 2251.1512 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 2251.1512. PRIOR APPROVAL FOR CERTAIN RESIDENTIAL
8	PROPERTY INSURANCE RATES. (a) An insurer may not use a rate for

- 9 residential property insurance until the insurer has filed the rate
- and all other information required by Section 2251.101 with the 10
- 11 department and the rate has been approved by the commissioner if the
- 12 commissioner determines that the insurer, or any of the insurer's
- affiliates and subsidiaries, as those terms are defined by Section 13
- 823.003, following a natural disaster: 14
- (1) has increased rates for residential property 15
- 16 insurance in the area affected by the natural disaster by five or
- 17 more percent; or
- 18 (2) has newly established deductibles for residential
- property insurance that are a percentage of the value of the 19
- 20 property insured.
- 21 (b) Sections 2251.151(b) and (d) apply to rates filed under
- 22 this section.
- 23 (c) Section 2251.152 does not apply to rates for which prior
- approval is required by this section. 24

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- 1 SECTION 2. Section 2251.156(a), Insurance Code, is amended
- 2 to read as follows:
- 3 (a) If the commissioner disapproves a rate filing under
- 4 Section 2251.153(a)(2) or Section 2251.1512, the commissioner
- 5 shall issue an order disapproving the filing in accordance with
- 6 Section 2251.103(b).
- 7 SECTION 3. The change in law made by this Act applies only
- 8 to rates for residential property insurance that is delivered,
- 9 issued for delivery, or renewed on or after January 1, 2012. Rates
- 10 for residential property insurance delivered, issued for delivery,
- 11 or renewed before January 1, 2012, are governed by the law as it
- 12 existed immediately before the effective date of this Act, and that
- 13 law is continued in effect for that purpose.
- 14 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
