- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 361.013, Health and Safety Code, is
- 6 amended by amending Subsection (a) and adding Subsection (j) to
- 7 read as follows:
- 8 (a) Except as provided by Subsections (e) through (j) [(i)],
- 9 the commission shall charge a fee on all solid waste that is
- 10 disposed of within this state. The fee is \$1.25 per ton received
- 11 for disposal at a municipal solid waste landfill if the solid waste
- 12 is measured by weight. If the solid waste is measured by volume,
- 13 the fee for compacted solid waste is 40 cents per cubic yard or, for
- 14 uncompacted solid waste, 25 cents per cubic yard received for
- 15 disposal at a municipal solid waste landfill. The commission shall
- 16 set the fee for sludge or similar waste applied to the land for
- 17 beneficial use on a dry weight basis and for solid waste received at
- 18 an incinerator or a shredding and composting facility at half the
- 19 fee set for solid waste received for disposal at a landfill. The
- 20 commission may charge comparable fees for other means of solid
- 21 waste disposal that are used.
- 22 (j) In this subsection, "construction or demolition waste"
- 23 means all materials that are by-products of construction work or
- 24 the demolition of buildings or other structures, including paper,

- 1 cartons, gypsum board, wood, excelsior, rubber, and plastics. The
- 2 commission shall charge a fee in addition to the fee charged under
- 3 Subsection (a) for all construction or demolition waste that is
- 4 disposed of within the state, except as provided by Subsection (h).
- 5 The additional fee is 80 percent of the fee charged under Subsection
- 6 <u>(a).</u>
- 7 SECTION 2. The changes in law made by this Act apply only to
- B fees charged for waste disposal on or after the effective date of
- 9 this Act.
- 10 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
