Subchapter A, Chapter 6003, Insurance Code, is 11 12 amended by adding Section 6003.004 to read as follows: Sec. 6003.004. PERSONAL INFORMATION CONFIDENTIAL. The home 13 address, home telephone number, driver's license number, and social 14 15 security number of a license holder or an applicant for a license under this chapter are confidential and are not subject to 16 17 disclosure under Chapter 552, Government Code. SECTION 3. Section 6003.052(b), Insurance Code, is amended 18 to read as follows: 19 (b) Under rules adopted under Section 6003.051(b), the 20 department: 21 (1) may create a specialized licensing or registration 22 program for fire protection sprinkler system contractors; and 23 24 (2) shall create a specialized licensing program for 25 fire protection sprinkler technicians. SECTION 4. Sections 6003.055(a) and (b), Insurance Code, 26 27 are amended to read as follows:

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(a) The commissioner shall set the fee for:

2 (1) a registration certificate application in an3 amount not to exceed \$100;

4 (2) an initial or renewal registration certificate in 5 an amount not to exceed \$1,200 annually; and

6 (3) an initial or renewal [responsible managing
7 employee] license fee in an amount not to exceed \$200 annually.

8 (b) Unless the examination for a [responsible managing 9 employee] license is administered by a testing service, the 10 commissioner shall set a nonrefundable fee for each examination in 11 an amount not to exceed \$100.

SECTION 5. Section 6003.156(a), Insurance Code, is amended to read as follows:

(a) The state fire marshal shall establish the scope and
type of an examination required by this chapter. <u>The state fire</u>
<u>marshal shall develop the examinations required under Section</u>
<u>6003.162 based on the most recent applicable guidelines published</u>
<u>by the National Fire Protection Association.</u>

SECTION 6. Section 6003.158(b), Insurance Code, is amended to read as follows:

(b) <u>A person who holds a license issued under Section</u> 6003.153 or 6003.162 must annually complete at least eight hours of continuing education in accordance with commissioner rules.

24 [Participation in the continuing education programs is voluntary.]

25 SECTION 7. Section 6003.159, Insurance Code, is amended to 26 read as follows:

27 Sec. 6003.159. RECIPROCAL LICENSE. The department shall

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1 [may] waive any license requirement for an applicant who holds a
2 license issued by another state <u>if the other state:</u>

3 (1) [that] has license requirements substantially 4 equivalent to the license requirements of this state; and

5 (2) has a reciprocal license statute that is 6 substantially equivalent to this section for individuals licensed 7 in this state.

8 SECTION 8. Section 6003.160, Insurance Code, is amended to 9 read as follows:

Sec. 6003.160. <u>LICENSE</u> NOT TRANSFERABLE; <u>SINGLE EMPLOYER</u>
<u>REQUIRED</u>. (a) A registration certificate or license issued under
this chapter is not transferable.

13 (b) An individual who holds a license issued under Section 14 6003.153 or 6003.162:

15 <u>(1) may not install, service, or maintain a fire</u> 16 protection sprinkler system unless the license holder is employed 17 by a fire protection sprinkler system contractor; and

18 (2) may not be employed by more than one fire 19 protection sprinkler system contractor at the same time.

20 SECTION 9. Subchapter D, Chapter 6003, Insurance Code, is 21 amended by adding Sections 6003.161, 6003.162, and 6003.163 to read 22 as follows:

23 <u>Sec. 6003.161. FIRE PROTECTION SPRINKLER TECHNICIAN:</u> 24 <u>LICENSE OR SUPERVISION REQUIRED. (a) An individual may not act as</u> 25 <u>a fire protection sprinkler technician unless the individual holds</u> 26 <u>a license issued by the department under Section 6003.153 or</u> 27 <u>6003.162, or is directly supervised by an individual who holds a</u>

An individual may install, service, or maintain only the type of fire protection sprinkler systems for which the 3 individual's license or the individual's direct supervisor's 4 5 license has been issued under this chapter. 6 (b) An individual may not use the term "licensed fire protection sprinkler technician" in the person's contracts or 7 8 advertising materials unless the individual holds a license issued under Section 6003.162. 9 Sec. 6003.162. FIRE PROTECTION SPRINKLER 10 TECHNICIAN LICENSES. (a) The department shall issue a general technician 11 12 license to an applicant: 13 (1) who has completed 8,000 hours of an apprenticeship program certified by the United States Department of Labor for the 14 15 inspection, service, and maintenance of fire protection sprinkler 16 systems; 17 (2) who: (A) has 8,000 hours of experience installing, 18 19 servicing, or maintaining fire protection sprinkler systems; and 20 (B) passes the department's general technician license examination; or 21 (3) who: 22 (A) has 6,000 hours of experience installing, 23 24 servicing, or maintaining fire protection sprinkler systems; and 25 (B) passes the National Institute for 26 Certification in Engineering Technologies, Level II test for inspection and testing of water-based systems. 27

No. 1853 1 (b) The department shall issue a dwelling technician 2 license to an applicant who: (1) has 4,000 hours of experience installing, 3 servicing, or maintaining fire protection sprinkler systems within 4 the scope of a dwelling technician license; and 5 (2) passes the department's dwelling technician 6 7 license examination. (c) The department shall issue an underground fire main 8 technician license to an applicant who: 9 (1) has 4,000 hours of experience installing, 10 servicing, or maintaining fire protection sprinkler systems within 11 12 the scope of an underground fire main technician license; and (2) passes the department's underground fire main 13 14 technician license examination. 15 (d) A license issued under this section must be conditioned on the successful completion of the applicable license examination 16 17 and compliance with the requirements of any applicable rules adopted under this chapter. 18 19 Sec. 6003.163. PRESENCE OF LICENSE HOLDER REQUIRED. Each fire protection sprinkler system contractor shall ensure that at 20 least one person who holds a license issued under Section 6003.153 21 or 6003.162 is present at a location where a fire protection 22 sprinkler system is being installed, maintained, repaired, or 23 tested by an employee of the fire protection sprinkler system 24 25 contractor. 26 SECTION 10. Section 6003.301(a), Insurance Code, is amended to read as follows: 27

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(a) A person commits an offense if the person knowingly
 violates Section 6003.151(a), 6003.153, <u>6003.161</u>, or 6003.251.

3 SECTION 11. (a) As soon as possible after the effective 4 date of this Act, and not later than September 1, 2012, the 5 commissioner of insurance and the state fire marshal shall adopt 6 the rules and establish the procedures and examination requirements 7 necessary to implement the licensing of fire protection sprinkler 8 technicians under Chapter 6003, Insurance Code, as amended by this 9 Act.

(b) A fire protection sprinkler technician is not required
to hold a license under Section 6003.161, Insurance Code, as added
by this Act, before September 1, 2013.

13 SECTION 12. Notwithstanding Sections 6003.161 and 14 6003.162, Insurance Code, as added by this Act, the Texas 15 Department of Insurance shall issue a license to a qualified 16 applicant under this section who:

17 (1) applies for a license under Chapter 6003,
18 Insurance Code, as amended by this Act, not later than September 1,
19 2013;

20 (2) submits to the department the information required21 by department rule;

(3) submits to the department the job description of
the position the applicant most recently performed and a sworn
statement by the applicant's employer attesting to the applicant's
job description;

(4) has at least the number of hours of experience
27 required by Section 6003.162, Insurance Code, as added by this Act,

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for the applicable license for which the applicant is applying; and
(5) pays the application and licensing fee.
SECTION 13. This Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
