A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to the regulation of certain private security companies
3	and occupations.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Section 1702.002, Occupations Code, is amended
6	by amending Subdivisions (1) and (6-a) and adding Subdivisions (4),
7	(4-a), and (13-a) to read as follows:
8	(1) "Alarm system" means:
9	(A) electronic equipment and devices designed to
10	detect or signal:
11	(i) an unauthorized entry or attempted
12	entry of a person or object into a residence, business, or area
13	monitored by the system; or
14	(ii) the occurrence of a robbery or other
15	emergency; or
16	(B) electronic equipment and devices using a
17	computer or data processor designed to control the access of a
18	person, vehicle, or object through a door, gate, or entrance into
19	the controlled area of a residence or business[; or
20	(C) a television camera or still camera system
21	that:
22	[(i) records or archives images of property

24 business; or

23 or individuals in a public or private area of a residence

1	[(ii) is monitored by security personnel or
2	services].
3	(4) "Closed circuit television or still camera system"
4	means a device or system of devices that:
5	(A) records or transmits, including transmission
6	by an intranet or Internet device, an image or series of images;
7	(B) is monitored by security personnel for the
8	purposes of security or surveillance; and
9	(C) is not used exclusively:
10	(i) to view or monitor traffic conditions
11	on public roads;
12	(ii) to detect motor vehicle violations on
13	<pre>public roads;</pre>
14	(iii) for telephone or video conferencing;
15	(iv) to monitor a manufacturing process;
16	(v) for a medical purpose by medical
17	<pre>practitioners;</pre>
18	(vi) by a courtroom reporter for recording
19	or archiving depositions or testimony;
20	(vii) in the course of an ongoing
21	investigation, when installed by and remaining under the control of
22	a licensed investigations company; or
23	(viii) by a law enforcement agency to
24	monitor criminal activity.
25	(4-a) "Camera systems company" means a person who
26	performs the activities described by Section 1702.1057.
27	(6-a) "Electronic access control device" means an

- 1 electronic, electrical, or computer-based device, including a
- 2 telephone entry system, that allows access to a controlled area [of
- 3 a business], but that is not monitored by security personnel or
- 4 services and does not send a signal to which law enforcement or
- 5 emergency services respond. The term does not include:
- 6 (A) a mechanical device, such as a deadbolt or
- 7 lock; or
- 8 (B) an operator for opening or closing a
- 9 commercial gate or door or an accessory, such as a fixed or portable
- 10 transmitter, card-reader, or keypad, if the operator or accessory
- 11 is used only to activate the gate or door and is not connected to an
- 12 alarm system.
- 13 "Lock" means a fastening device that:
- 14 (A) is used to secure, regulate, activate, or
- 15 control a door, gate, drawer, cabinet, safe, or automobile by means
- 16 of a mechanical or electric device, including a latch, bolt, key,
- 17 transmitter, card-reader, keypad, or proximity key fob; and
- 18 (B) is not monitored by security personnel or
- 19 services and does not send a signal to which law enforcement or
- 20 <u>emergency services respond</u>.
- 21 SECTION 2. Section 1702.021(a), Occupations Code, is
- 22 amended to read as follows:
- 23 (a) The Texas Private Security Board consists of <u>nine</u>
- 24 [seven] members appointed by the governor with the advice and
- 25 consent of the senate as follows:
- 26 (1) five [four] public members, each of whom is a
- 27 citizen of the United States;

- 1 (2) one member who is licensed under this chapter as a
- 2 private investigator;
- 3 (3) one member who is licensed under this chapter as an
- 4 alarm systems company; [and]
- 5 (4) one member who is licensed under this chapter as
- 6 the owner or operator of a guard company; and
- 7 (5) one member who is licensed under this chapter as a
- 8 locksmith.
- 9 SECTION 3. Section 1702.102(a), Occupations Code, is
- 10 amended to read as follows:
- 11 (a) Unless the person holds a license as a security services
- 12 contractor, a person may not:
- 13 (1) act as an alarm systems company, armored car
- 14 company, camera systems company, courier company, guard company,
- 15 guard dog company, locksmith company, or private security
- 16 consultant company;
- 17 (2) offer to perform the services of a company in
- 18 Subdivision (1); or
- 19 (3) engage in business activity for which a license is
- 20 required under this chapter.
- 21 SECTION 4. Section 1702.1056(a), Occupations Code, is
- 22 amended to read as follows:
- 23 (a) A person acts as a locksmith company for the purposes of
- 24 this chapter if the person:
- 25 (1) for a fee and with legal authorization, sells,
- 26 installs, services, [ex] maintains, bypasses, or defeats
- 27 <u>electronic access control devices</u> or [offers to sell, install,

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- 1 service, or maintain, mechanical security devices, including
- 2 deadbolts and locks;
- 3 (2) advertises services <u>traditionally</u> offered by <u>a</u>
- 4 [the] company using the term "locksmith"; or
- 5 (3) includes the term "locksmith" in the company's
- 6 name.
- 7 SECTION 5. Subchapter F, Chapter 1702, Occupations Code, is
- 8 amended by adding Section 1702.1057 to read as follows:
- 9 Sec. 1702.1057. CAMERA SYSTEMS COMPANY. A person acts as a
- 10 camera systems company for purposes of this chapter if the person:
- 11 (1) sells, installs, services, or monitors a closed
- 12 circuit television or still camera system; or
- 13 (2) offers to perform a service described by
- 14 Subdivision (1).
- SECTION 6. Section 1702.221(b), Occupations Code, is
- 16 amended to read as follows:
- 17 (b) An individual must obtain the appropriate endorsement
- 18 in accordance with the requirements of this chapter and related
- 19 administrative rules if the individual:
- 20 (1) is employed as:
- 21 (A) an alarm instructor;
- 22 (B) an alarm systems installer;
- (D) an electronic access control device
- 25 installer;
- 26 (E) a level 3 classroom or firearm instructor;

- 15 SECTION 7. Section 1702.2227(a), Occupations Code, is amended to read as follows: 16
- 17 (a) An individual acts as a locksmith for the purposes of this chapter if the person: 18
- 19 for a fee and with legal authorization, sells,
- installs, services, [or] maintains, bypasses, or defeats 20
- electronic access control devices or mechanical security devices, 21
- including deadbolts and locks; or 22

- (2) advertises or offers locksmith services to the 23
- 24 public or represents to the public that the person is a locksmith.
- 25 SECTION 8. Subchapter J, Chapter 1702, Occupations Code, is
- amended by adding Section 1702.2228 to read as follows: 26
- 27 Sec. 1702.2228. CAMERA SYSTEMS INSTALLER. An individual

- 1 acts as a camera systems installer for purposes of this chapter if
- 2 the individual:
- 3 (1) installs, maintains, or repairs a closed circuit
- 4 television or still camera system; or
- 5 (2) advertises or offers the services under
- 6 Subdivision (1) to the public or represents to the public that the
- 7 person is a camera systems installer.
- 8 SECTION 9. Section 1702.288, Occupations Code, is amended
- 9 by adding Subsection (f) to read as follows:
- 10 (f) A license holder acting as an alarm systems company does
- 11 not have to provide the notice required under Subsection (d) if the
- 12 contact information, including the address and the telephone
- 13 numbers for the alarm company, has not changed.
- 14 SECTION 10. Section 1702.328, Occupations Code, is amended
- 15 to read as follows:
- 16 Sec. 1702.328. SECURITY SYSTEMS SALES AND INSTALLATION
- 17 EXEMPTIONS. This chapter does not apply to:
- 18 (1) a person who owns and installs <u>an alarm system or</u>
- 19 [a burglar] detection [or alarm] device, electronic access control
- 20 device, lock, or closed circuit television or still camera system
- 21 on the person's own property or[, if the person does not charge for
- 22 the device or the installation, installs the system or device for
- 23 the protection of the person's personal property located on another
- 24 person's property and does not, as a normal business practice,
- 25 install the systems or devices on the property of another, and who
- 26 does not perform any other act that requires a license under this
- 27 chapter;

- 1 (2) a person in the business of building construction
- 2 that installs electrical wiring and devices that may include in
- 3 part the installation of \underline{an} [\underline{a} burglar] alarm $\underline{system}_{\bullet}$ [\underline{or}]
- 4 detection device, electronic access control device, lock, or closed
- 5 circuit television or still camera system if:
- 6 (A) the person is a party to a contract that
- 7 provides that:
- 8 (i) the installation will be performed,
- 9 [under the direct supervision of, and] inspected, and certified
- 10 by $[\tau]$ a person licensed to install and certify the alarm system,
- 11 [or] detection device, electronic access control device, lock, or
- 12 <u>closed circuit television or still camera system;</u> and
- 13 (ii) the license holder assumes full
- 14 responsibility for the installation of the $\underline{\text{system}}$ [$\underline{\text{alarm}}$] or
- 15 [detection] device; and
- 16 (B) the person does not service or maintain alarm
- 17 systems, electronic access control devices, locks, closed circuit
- 18 <u>television or still camera systems</u>, or detection devices;
- 19 (3) a person who sells or installs automobile burglar
- 20 alarm devices and who does not perform any other act that requires a
- 21 license under this chapter; or
- 22 (4) a person who sells exclusively by e-commerce, over
- 23 the counter transactions, or mail order, alarm systems, electronic
- 24 access control devices, locks, or detection devices and who does
- 25 not perform any other act that requires a license under this
- 26 chapter.
- 27 SECTION 11. (a) The changes in law made by this Act to

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- 1 Chapter 1702, Occupations Code, apply only to an application for an
- 2 original or renewal license, registration, or endorsement
- 3 submitted to the Texas Private Security Board on or after January 1,
- 4 2012. An application submitted before January 1, 2012, is governed
- 5 by the law in effect on the date the application was submitted, and
- 6 the former law is continued in effect for that purpose.
- 7 (b) Not later than February 1, 2013, the governor shall
- 8 appoint the members of the Texas Private Security Board necessary
- 9 to ensure the composition of the board complies with Section
- 10 1702.021, Occupations Code, as amended by this Act.
- 11 (c) The Texas Private Security Board shall adopt rules to
- 12 implement the changes in law made by this Act not later than January
- 13 1, 2012. A person is not required to obtain a registration or
- 14 endorsement under Section 1702.2228, Occupations Code, as added by
- 15 this Act, before January 1, 2012.
- 16 SECTION 12. This Act takes effect immediately if it
- 17 receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each
- 18 house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution.
- 19 If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate
- 20 effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
