9	grants a petition to create a district, the district may be created
10	only if at least 40 registered voters reside in the district on the
11	date of the election held to confirm the district's creation.
12	(b) This section prevails over a conflicting or
13	inconsistent provision of a special or local law that governs a
14	specific district.
15	SECTION 2. Subchapter B, Chapter 54, Water Code, is amended
16	by adding Section 54.0211 to read as follows:
17	Sec. 54.0211. REGISTERED VOTERS REQUIRED FOR CONFIRMATION
18	ELECTION. (a) If, under Section 54.021, the commission grants a
19	petition to create a district, the district may be created only if
20	at least 40 registered voters reside in the district on the date of
21	the election held to confirm the district's creation.
22	(b) This section prevails over a conflicting or
23	inconsistent provision of a special or local law that governs a
24	specific district.

1 SECTION 3. Sections 53.0201 and 54.0211, Water Code, as 2 added by this Act, apply only to a district for which a petition is 3 granted on or after the effective date of this Act. A district for 4 which a petition is granted before the effective date of this Act is 5 subject to the law in effect when the petition is granted, and that 6 law is continued in effect for that purpose.

7 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 8 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 9 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 10 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 11 Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
