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2 SECTION 3. Section 25.0342, Education Code, is amended by 3 amending Subsection (a) and adding Subsections (b-1) and (b-2) to 4 read as follows:

(a) In this section, "bullying" <u>has the meaning assigned by</u>
<u>Section 37.0832</u> [means engaging in written or verbal expression or
physical conduct that a school district board of trustees or the
<u>board's designee determines</u>:

9 [(1) will have the effect of physically harming a 10 student, damaging a student's property, or placing a student in 11 reasonable fear of harm to the student's person or of damage to the 12 student's property; or

13 [(2) is sufficiently severe, persistent, or pervasive 14 enough that the action or threat creates an intimidating, 15 threatening, or abusive educational environment for a student].

16 (b-1) The board of trustees of a school district may 17 transfer the student who engaged in bullying to:

18 (1) another classroom at the campus to which the 19 victim was assigned at the time the bullying occurred; or

20 (2) a campus in the district other than the campus to 21 which the victim was assigned at the time the bullying occurred.

22 (b-2) Section 37.004 applies to a transfer under Subsection
23 (b-1) of a student with a disability who receives special education
24 services.

25 SECTION 4. Section 28.002, Education Code, is amended by 26 adding Subsection (s) to read as follows:

27 (s) In this subsection, "bullying" has the meaning assigned

by Section 37.0832 and "harassment" has the meaning assigned by 1 Section 37.001. In addition to any other essential knowledge and 2 skills the State Board of Education adopts for the health 3 curriculum under Subsection (a)(2)(B), the board shall adopt for 4 the health curriculum, in consultation with the Texas School Safety 5 Center, essential knowledge and skills that include evidence-based 6 practices that will effectively address awareness, prevention, 7 identification, and resolution of and intervention in bullying and 8 harassment. 9 10 SECTION 5. Section 37.001(b), Education Code, is amended to read as follows: 11 12 (b) In this section: 13 (1)"Bullying" has the meaning assigned by Section 14 37.0832. 15 (2) "Harassment" means threatening to cause harm or bodily injury to another student, engaging in sexually intimidating 16 conduct, causing physical damage to the property of another 17 student, subjecting another student to physical confinement or 18 19 restraint, or maliciously taking any action that substantially harms another student's physical or emotional health or safety. 20 21 (3) [(2)] "Hit list" means a list of people targeted to be harmed, using: 22 23 a firearm, as defined by Section 46.01(3), (A) 24 Penal Code; 25 (B) a knife, as defined by Section 46.01(7), 26 Penal Code; or 27 (C) any other object to be used with intent to

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1 cause bodily harm.

2 SECTION 6. Section 37.083(a), Education Code, is amended to 3 read as follows:

(a) Each school district shall adopt and implement a
discipline management program to be included in the district
improvement plan under Section 11.252. The program must provide for
prevention of and education concerning unwanted physical or verbal
aggression and [7] sexual harassment [7 and other forms of
bullying] in school, on school grounds, and in school vehicles.

10 SECTION 7. Subchapter C, Chapter 37, Education Code, is 11 amended by adding Section 37.0832 to read as follows:

Sec. 37.0832. BULLYING PREVENTION POLICIES AND PROCEDURES.
(a) In this section, "bullying" means engaging in written or verbal
expression, expression through electronic means, or physical
conduct that occurs on school property, at a school-sponsored or
school-related activity, or on a vehicle operated by the district
and that:

18 (1) has the effect or will have the effect of 19 physically harming a student, damaging a student's property, or 20 placing a student in reasonable fear of harm to the student's person 21 or of damage to the student's property;

22 (2) is sufficiently severe, persistent, and pervasive
23 enough that the action or threat creates an intimidating,
24 threatening, or abusive educational environment for a student;

25 (3) exploits an imbalance of power between the student 26 perpetrator and the student victim through written or verbal 27 expression or physical conduct; and

1	(4) interferes with a student's education or
2	substantially disrupts the operation of a school.
3	(b) The board of trustees of each school district shall
4	adopt a policy, including any necessary procedures, concerning
5	bullying that:
6	(1) prohibits the bullying of a student;
7	(2) prohibits retaliation against any person,
8	including a victim, a witness, or another person, who in good faith
9	provides information concerning an incident of bullying;
10	(3) establishes a procedure for providing notice of an
11	incident of bullying to a parent or guardian of the victim and a
12	parent or guardian of the bully within a reasonable amount of time
13	after the incident;
14	(4) establishes the actions a student should take to
15	obtain assistance and intervention in response to bullying;
16	(5) sets out the available counseling options for a
17	student who is a victim of or a witness to bullying or who engages in
18	bullying; and
19	(6) establishes procedures for reporting an incident
20	of bullying, investigating a reported incident of bullying, and
21	determining whether the reported incident of bullying occurred.
22	(c) The policy and any necessary procedures adopted under
23	Subsection (b) must be included in:
24	(1) any student or employee school district handbook;
25	and
26	(2) the district improvement plan under Section
27	11.252.

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(d) The procedure for reporting bullying established under
 Subsection (b) must be posted on the district's Internet website to
 the extent practicable.

4 SECTION 8. This Act applies beginning with the 2011-2012 5 school year.

6 SECTION 9. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 7 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 8 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 9 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 10 Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
