A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to the proof of identity and residency required of an
- 3 applicant for a driver's license or personal identification
- 4 certificate.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Section 521.142(a), Transportation Code, is
- 7 amended to read as follows:
- 8 (a) An application for an original license must state the
- 9 applicant's full name and place and date of birth. This
- 10 information must be verified by presentation of proof of identity
- 11 satisfactory to the department and in compliance with the laws and
- 12 constitution of this state and the United States. The department
- 13 must accept as satisfactory proof of identity under this subsection
- 14 an offender identification card or similar form of identification
- 15 issued to an inmate by the Texas Department of Criminal Justice [if
- 16 the applicant also provides supplemental verifiable records or
- 17 documents that aid in establishing identity].
- SECTION 2. Subchapter G, Chapter 521, Transportation Code,
- 19 is amended by adding Section 521.1422 to read as follows:
- Sec. 521.1422. EVIDENCE OF IDENTITY AND RESIDENCY. (a)
- 21 Except as provided by Subsection (f), an applicant for an original,
- 22 <u>duplicate</u>, or renewal license or an original, duplicate, or renewal
- 23 personal identification certificate must provide the department
- 24 with:

1 (1) one piece of primary identification; 2 two pieces of secondary identification, one of which provides evidence of the applicant's identity and one of 3 which provides evidence of the applicant's current residence 4 5 address in this state; or 6 (3) if the applicant's identity and current residence 7 address in this state cannot be established by the identification provided under Subdivision (1) or (2), or both, one piece of 8 secondary identification that provides evidence of the applicant's 9 identity or the applicant's current residence address in this state 10 and two pieces of supporting identification that provide evidence 11 12 of the applicant's identity and residence address. (b) If the document contains the applicant's full name and 13 14 date of birth, the department shall accept the following as primary 15 identification under Subsection (a)(1): 16 (1) an unexpired driver's license or personal 17 identification certificate issued by the department that bears a photograph of the applicant; 18 19 (2) an unexpired United States passport; (3) a United States citizenship or naturalization 20 certificate that bears a photograph of the applicant; 21 22 (4) an unexpired United States Bureau of Citizenship and Immigration Services document that bears a photograph of the 23 24 applicant; (5) an unexpired United States military 25 26 identification card that bears a photograph of the applicant; 27 (6) a passport issued by a foreign country,

- 1 accompanied by a visa issued by the United States Department of
- 2 State with an unexpired I-94 marked valid for a fixed duration; or
- 3 (7) a passport issued by a foreign country,
- 4 accompanied by a visa issued by the United States Department of
- 5 State with an I-94 marked valid for the duration of stay and
- 6 appropriate documentation.
- 7 (c) The department shall accept the following as secondary
- 8 identification under Subsection (a)(2) or (3), if the name of the
- 9 applicant is shown:
- 10 (1) an unexpired driver's license or identification
- 11 card or certificate issued by another state or territory of the
- 12 United States, the District of Columbia, or a province of Canada
- 13 that bears a photograph of the applicant;
- 14 (2) an original or certified copy of a court order from
- 15 <u>a court in this or another state of the United States that shows the</u>
- 16 name and date of birth of the applicant and indicates that the court
- 17 authorized or required a change in the official recordation of the
- 18 applicant's name, gender, or both;
- 19 (3) school records, including a student
- 20 <u>identification card issued by a public, private, or parochial</u>
- 21 school, college, or university;
- 22 (4) United States military records;
- 23 (5) an unexpired United States military dependant
- 24 identification card;
- 25 (6) an original or certified copy of a marriage
- 26 license or divorce decree;
- 27 (7) a voter registration card;

1 (8) a driver's license temporary receipt issued by the 2 department; 3 (9) a motor vehicle liability insurance policy covering a vehicle that satisfies Subchapter D, Chapter 601, and 4 5 was issued within the preceding six months, or a photocopy of the 6 policy; or 7 (10) a receipt for the payment of ad valorem taxes imposed on residential property in this state that lists the 8 applicant as the owner or a joint owner of the property and includes 9 10 the street address of the property. (d) The department shall accept the following as supporting 11 identification under Subsection (a)(3) if the name of the applicant 12 13 is shown: 14 (1) an insurance policy that has been in effect for at 15 least two years, or a photocopy of the policy; 16 (2) a social security card; 17 (3) a pilot's license issued by the Federal Aviation 18 Administration; 19 (4) a license to carry a concealed handgun issued by 20 the department; 21 (5) an original or certified copy of a birth 22 certificate issued by an agency of this state, another state or territory of the United States, the District of Columbia, or a 23 24 province of Canada; 25 (6) an original or certified copy of a Consular Report 26 of Birth Abroad of a Citizen of the United States of America;

(7) a driver's license or identification certificate

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- 1 or card issued by another state or a territory of the United States,
- 2 the District of Columbia, or a province of Canada that expired
- 3 within the preceding two years;
- 4 (8) a consular document issued by a state or national
- 5 government;
- 6 (9) a utility bill for water, sewer, electricity, gas,
- 7 telephone, or cable service that was issued in the preceding 60 days
- 8 and bears the applicant's street address in this state;
- 9 (10) an unexpired credit card or debit card that bears
- 10 a photograph of the applicant;
- 11 (11) a monthly statement issued in the preceding 60
- 12 days by a bank, credit union, or other financial institution that
- 13 bears the applicant's street address in this state;
- 14 (12) immunization records; or
- 15 (13) one or more expired documents issued by a state,
- 16 territory, district, province, or government that would qualify as
- 17 a form of primary or secondary identification if unexpired.
- 18 (e) The department may determine that a document that is not
- 19 included in Subsection (a), (b), or (c) may be accepted as evidence
- 20 of an applicant's identity or residency in this state. The
- 21 department may not require an applicant to provide a document that
- 22 <u>is not included in those subsections.</u>
- 23 <u>(f) The department shall accept an unexpired license or</u>
- 24 personal identification certificate issued to the applicant by the
- 25 department as sufficient proof of the identity and residency of an
- 26 applicant for a renewal or duplicate license or personal
- 27 identification certificate and may not require the applicant to

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- 1 provide additional information to establish identity or residency.
- 2 (g) To the extent of a conflict between this section and
- 3 another provision of this chapter, this section controls.
- 4 SECTION 3. The changes in law made by this Act apply only to
- 5 an application for a driver's license or personal identification
- 6 certificate that is filed on or after the effective date of this
- 7 Act. An application for a driver's license or personal
- 8 identification certificate that was filed before the effective date
- 9 of this Act is subject to the law in effect on the date the
- 10 application was filed, and the former law is continued in effect for
- 11 that purpose.
- 12 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
