BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: SECTION 1. Subtitle B, Title 9, Health and Safety Code, is amended by adding Chapter 784 to read as follows: CHAPTER 784. CRITICAL INCIDENT STRESS MANAGEMENT AND CRISIS Sec. 784.001. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter: (1) "Crisis response service" means consultation, risk assessment, referral, and on-site crisis intervention services provided by an emergency response team member to an emergency service provider affected by a crisis, of disaster. (2) "Critical incident stress" means the acute or unulative psychological stress or trauma that an emergency service provider may experience in providing emergency services in response to a critical incident, including a crisis, disaster, or emergency. (3) "Critical incident stress management service" means a service provider a process of crisis intervention designed to assist an emergency service provider in coping with critical incident stress. The term includes consultation, counseling, debriefing, defusing, intervention services, case management services as a member of an organized team or in association with the governmental unit.
